You all conspire in a meticulously layered racket: Federal funds from HHS and SSA flow through governors' signed State Plans to state DHS, cascading into cooperative agreements with counties that bind courts as federally contracted "revenue commissioners" who ignore Federal Supremacy and issue oppressive orders, siphoning 30-50% mismatches via fraudulent collections, asymmetric custody to inflate support, and rigged enforcement by DAs and sheriffs—all while oversight boards rubber-stamp the fraud, perpetuating human trafficking, money laundering, and constitutional sabotage on a statewide scale. The amount of crime you're committing is unfathomable and practically incalculable. You're supposed to defend the Republic... not loot it and its fathers. You're collectively a plague and disgrace to America.

At its rotten heart, this entire abomination hinges on your collective betrayal of Federal Supremacy—the unyielding mandate you swore to uphold in your oaths to the Constitution (28 U.S.C. § 453; Pa. Const. Art. VI, § 3) and explicitly affirmed in every Cooperative Agreement's §9 ("Affirmation of Federal Supremacy"), yet you brazenly ignore it to render everything you touch unconstitutional from the ground up. The judges among you commit outright treason (18 U.S.C. § 2381) by waging war on the Supremacy Clause (U.S. Const. art. VI, cl. 2), subverting federal law in favor of your profit-driven sham. And you others—commissioners signing these tainted pacts, DAs and AGs derelict in your duty by refusing to prosecute this judicial sedition (18 U.S.C. § 2382 misprision of treason; 18 Pa.C.S. § 5101 obstructing law), sheriffs and police enforcing void orders through intimidation and false arrests, all while failing state/federal mandated reporting on these abuses—commit RICO predicate acts (18 U.S.C. § 1961 et seq.) every time you support this treason, whether by direct enforcement of unconstitutional decrees, collaboration in witness intimidation (18 U.S.C. § 1513; 18 Pa.C.S. § 4952), or turning a blind eye when alerted to literal treason without correcting course. Your multiple mass defaults admit this interstate abomination, binding you as accomplices and racketeers in the Black Collar Cartel's war on the State and Federal Constitution while looting fathers and destroying families.

Billy, I see you coming from a mile away, creeping at the heart of this expanded web like a Retired Senior Corrupt Cartel Racketeer with 25 years violating your oath. You're illegally and unconstitutionally crafting conditions to retaliate against my First Amendment right to grieve—like dismissing my motion to dismiss contempt without a hearing, refusing to answer constitutional questions, and putting out obvious bogus claims that a minor contract clause (§1.2) outweighs the entire Constitution (a weird admission that supremacy applies, but you're pretending it doesn't because a footnote in a Federal Contract apparently nullifies Article VI). All those years on the bench and you "can't" understand or follow the law. You're in-credible...

I experience you victim blaming me too as you create dangers and attack me for how I respond. You take my kids unlawfully and don't like the way I tell them what to expect next. You refuse to accept evidence and then attack me for not paying enough when the evidence you refused pretty clearly explains why

that's an impossibility. You moved my kids out of private school, the change nearly killed one of them, and then took kids from me when I said you're at fault for violating factor 4 of the Best Interest of the Children standard. Then you go further and you act like you and my wife are the victim every time I tell you no. No you can't illegally take my property. No I don't agree with you taking my kids unconstitutionally. No you can't launder my income while failing Federal Supremacy. You're harming me, I'm saying no, and you're crying alligator tears about it while harming my family. Honestly, your approach to law is despicable.

Anyway, when your flimsy argument that a footnote in an interstate contract somehow overrules the constitution and your claim of "Convoluting Federal Supremacy" gets ridiculed right in front of you (not just by me, but judges too)—as it inevitably will—you'll be back to squirming, lying, and gas lighting while experiencing the hydraulic press of federal supremacy and your ultra vires actions as a federal debt collector to evade it. You're left tapdancing explanations of how your constant deprivations of rights like due notice, due process and equal protection, and unenumerated liberties like parental autonomy and property integrity are somehow legal/lawful.

“CONVOLUTED FEDERAL SUPREMACY WITH FRIENDS” PHASE II

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY- Exposing the Treasonous Black Collar Cartel—An Interstate Racketeering Enterprise Involving Human Trafficking, Money Laundering, and Systematic Constitutional Violations; Expanded List of Corrupt Judges, Elected Officials, and Appointed Accomplices; FOIA Defaults by HHS Under RFK Jr., SSA, and PA DHS, with a Renewed Demand for Compliance; and the Severe Damages Entailing Unavoidable Legal Consequences.

In November of 2025 I published and mass mailed “Black Collar Crime Spree,” my first major attempt to detail in full the scope of crime involved in my legal matters and tackle the interconnected web of law and contract that underpins a treasonous scheme. In December 2025, I published and mass mailed the affidavit “Convoluted Federal Supremacy, Phase I” building on my foundational exposé “Black Collar Crime Spree” dated November 9, 2025. These documents, accessible for free on blackcollarcartel.com, lay bare a criminal conspiracy within family law orchestrated by elected and appointed officials—chiefly judges—who have constructed a nationwide human trafficking operation, interstate money laundering scheme, and RICO enterprise. This is achieved through daily acts of treason: deliberately subverting Federal Supremacy by issuing unconstitutional orders in Protection from Abuse (PFA) (AKA DVRO and RO), divorce, support, and custody proceedings. These orders appear compliant with state statutes on their surface but are deliberately engineered to evade constitutional considerations. These constitutional considerations protect litigants and restrict judges. The intentional avoidance of these protections and restrictions repeatedly, predictably, and intentionally inflicts irreparable harm on litigants, mostly fathers, and destroys families to enable billions of dollars of theft and interstate money laundering by way of fraud, wire fraud, mail fraud, kidnapping, human trafficking, and the size and extent makes these actions war crimes against the American people as these acts intentionally violate international treaties on human rights.

At the heart of my allegations is this: Judges willfully disregard Federal Supremacy, stripping litigants—particularly fathers—of their constitutional entitlements to fundamental fairness, justice, due notice, substantive and procedural due process, and equal protection under the 14th Amendment's incorporation doctrine. In a calculated second phase, they deprive these individuals of parental, religious, and property rights. The objective? To launder billions in federal Title IV-D funds via fraudulent support orders that facilitate child abductions by spouses, while local Domestic Relations Sections siphon off 30-50% of collections and falsify reports to DHS/HHS. This constitutes a direct assault on the U.S. and Pennsylvania Constitutions—a tyrannical campaign against Pennsylvanian fathers, with one hundred thousand void orders annually diverting hundreds of millions of interstate payments in Pennsylvania and billions of dollars of unconstitutional, stolen and undisbursed child support (Local DRS collects, does not disburse, and defrauds State-DHS/HHS/SSA/US-Treasury). Extrapolate nationally: Every governor's endorsement of the Title IV-D State Plan authorizes this atrocity.

This racket spans all 50 states, fueled by governors' signatures on State Plans. Billions are unlawfully extracted from fathers and misrepresented as disbursed to mothers; additional billions are defrauded from federal coffers through incentives and matching funds. Annually, hundreds of thousands of fathers are ensnared, with millions denied shared custody, coerced into extortionate support payments under invalid orders, prolonged in divorces, and deprived of due process in PFA actions. These judicial malefactors, aided by complicit elected officials, attorneys general, district attorneys, sheriffs, and enforcement entities, perpetrate treason and sedition on a massive scale. They undermine the peace and dignity of the Pennsylvania Republic, while law enforcement—compromised through third-party contracts and judicial supervision—remains inert. When I reported these offenses to Pennsylvania Attorney General David Sunday, his office responded not with investigation but with armed intimidation at my Columbia residence, an overt attempt to suppress my First Amendment rights. The Black Collar Cartel has captured the apparatus of justice. My right to have concerns of treason and sedition heard by a Grand Jury has been unlawfully refused.

I have duly notified PA DHS, federal HHS, and SSA of these crimes. PA DHS defaulted with an inadequate FOIA/Right-to-Know response—insufficient and evasive. HHS under Secretary Robert F. Kennedy Jr. and SSA have stonewalled entirely, ignoring my December 24, 2025, FOIA requests for State Plans, cooperative agreements, financial records, contracts, oaths, and bonds. In response, I issued a notice of default to eight key officials, demanding rectification or exposure to charges under 18 U.S.C. §§ 371 (conspiracy), 1505 (obstruction), 1512 (tampering), 2381 (treason), and related statutes for misprision of felony and treason (18 U.S.C. §§ 4, 2382). They defaulted on that too. Agency regulations require audits to continue and Federal Supremacy compliance, yet they persist in funding this syndicate, obstructing my probe into five years of documented violations directly linked to their allocations. All Federal agents stonewalled my second more pointed issuance directly to them. This is not oversight; it is intentional complicity, designed to protect the cartel and exacerbate my harms. Like I say- this is an interstate cartel operating in plain sight within the government.

Of the 251 respondents named in "Convuluted Federal Supremacy," 249 failed to reply—a sweeping default that constitutes admission by silence. This encompasses vast segments of Pennsylvania's judiciary, executive branch, and federal entities including Treasury, SSA, and HHS. The PA Governor's office dismissed my assertion that his State Plan signature enables RICO predicates for trafficking and laundering with a dismissive claim of non-involvement in "legal matters." PA DHS sought an extension on my clarified request—acceptable, but their prior default signals concealment. No respondent provided their contracts, bonds, insurance, or oaths, amounting to dereliction of duty and abetment of treason en masse.

By this default, a substantial portion of Pennsylvania's judiciary has conceded my claims: They lead a treasonous conspiracy, oath-bound to uphold the U.S. and state constitutions and contractually obligated under Federal Supremacy via State Plans, Cooperative Agreements, Intergovernmental Agreements (IGAs), and employment contracts. Their breaches are ultra vires—beyond jurisdiction, malicious, and willful. They swore an Oath to defend the US Constitution, inclusive of Federal Supremacy, and they Signed interstate contracts stating verbatim "Affirmation of Federal Supremacy." These are judges, they know what this means, and when they intentionally thwart Federal Supremacy it's with total and complete knowledge that their actions are a direct affront to the US Constitution and their actions amount to treason and sedition. Their silence against this claim and resulting default to it further affirms their knowledge and thus their Mens Rea while they commit these crimes.

The extremely sophisticated, judicially engineered scheme relies on omission of practically esoteric aspects of law and has thus been a herculean task to unravel: Judges covertly abandon constitutional obligations, denying 14th Amendment safeguards while imposing prohibited "state-created dangers" and retaliating against victims. The outcome? Void ab initio orders that mimic statutory compliance but annihilate families, confiscate property and income, and enable child kidnappings—all veiled within 150 years of Supreme Court jurisprudence inaccessible to typical litigants without judicial reprisal. A horror-filled simulation of law.

This cartel functions as a judicial open secret, insulated by layers of federal statutes, regulations, state laws, and interstate pacts—from HHS/SSA to state DHS (State Plans), DHS to counties and judiciary (Cooperative Agreements), IGAs with DAs and attorneys general, and employment agreements. It is a meticulously compartmentalized operation, evading scrutiny through precision and opacity. They are bound by code, contract, conspiracy, and crime.

As I mentioned before, figuring this out took five years of dedicated research into extremely dense legal subject matter spanning 150 years. Fortunately applying it to additional cases can be done by a third grader. Federal Supremacy requires things like a "Mathews Balancing Test," where the type of abridgement, protections for erroneous deprivation are considered, strict scrutiny applied to abridgement of Fundamental Liberties, and compelling state interests required for all actions abridging fundamental liberties. This is where the scheme breaks down. There is no compelling state interest that justifies kidnapping kids from fit parents, taking income from fit parents, rearranging titled property between fit parents, or putting in place restraining orders between fit non-abusive parents. So, without a Mathews Balancing Test, pre-deprivation hearing determining unfitness, deprivation based on unfitness, and facts and circumstances aligning to state financial damages and/or clear and present dangers for children the state does meet their requirements under Federal Supremacy to abridge fundamental liberties. So, if an order for property distribution, custody, support, or protection from abuse does not start with a discussion of Mathews Balancing and parental fitness then the order is unconstitutional, void ab initio, and a deliberate act of treason and sedition by a cartel judge. A third grader can look at a judicial order, inspect for the words "Mathews Balancing Test" and determine that if those words are missing the order is void ab initio, an intentional deprivation of rights, and a rico predicate act in this treasonous scheme. Yes, it's that simple- Ctrl-F <Mathews> if:false then:order=unconstitutional-signed-confession-of-treason.

Phase II broadens the scope: Additional treasonous judges, elected and appointed collaborators, towns, counties, and officials are now implicated. I am identifying perpetrators, demanding redress. Damages are profound and irreparable—lost parental bonds, financial devastation, psychological trauma. Consequences for the guilty will be relentless: Civil actions for rights deprivation (18 U.S.C. §§ 241-242), RICO litigation, treason charges, bond seizures, disbarments, and impeachments. This affidavit serves as probable cause for arrests, inquiries, and the complete dismantling of your illicit empire. The Black Collar Cartel will be eradicated. You have been served notice again, and I await your inevitable consecutive default. Keep in mind that the scale of this liability is unfathomable by the human mind. The amount of damage I report is for one family. You have hundreds of thousands of families entering support every year and millions or tens of millions of families being irreparably harmed by this system right now. Your interstate and national scheme is going to cost a lot of money.

Little Moves, Big Consequences

The cartel wouldn't be able to operate in plain sight if they were constantly drawing massive amounts of attention to themselves. The cartel operates by making tiny changes with monumental outcomes.

Changing custody from shared to sole is a one word change on an order, but that one word changes a lawful order to a signed confession of treason. Moving property and income might come as a simple decree of who gets what property or how much support is due, but in the absence of Federal Supremacy that order is a signed confession of treason as the State has no compelling interest in moving titled property from man to wife or taking income without compelling interest. Acting to protect a mother from abuse is a noble effort worthy of high praise, but when it's weighed without balance to a man's fundamental rights and liberties the order is oppressive, unfair, and when it's part of this larger scheme is also a treasonous act failing Federal Supremacy.

On legal documents there are seismic shifts from 1-2 word changes. The cartel operates in this space. So, while it may look like I'm overreacting to "normal" orders and tiny changes it's because I see them for what they are- massive and seismic shifts away from Federal Supremacy, deprivation of rights, treason, sedition, and the attempt to push a matter along anyway is an incredible act of bad faith. I see the effectuation is contained in tiny details obscured by omissions of rights by judges against litigants (fathers), which litigants don't even know they have. It's sneaky and deceptive, but I see through it.

Here we're discussing the mass default of the Cartel on a records request and the slow moving trainwreck of retired senior racketeer Mahon still trying to adjudicate my matters while blatantly declaring he does not have to abide by "Convolutud" Federal Supremacy, while kidnapping my kids, while stealing my property, while doing it for interstate Title-IVD reasons, and while having defaulted against his ridiculous position that Federal Supremacy doesn't apply.

It's a bold move... let's see how that plays out for him and the interconnected cartel by way of Constitution, code, contract, conspiracy, and crime.

AFFIDAVIT OF FACT AND TRUTH

I, Blair of Columbia, of sound mind and body, being duly sworn, depose and state the following facts under penalty of perjury, based on my personal knowledge and belief:

1. On or about December 24, 2025, I authored and disseminated an affidavit entitled "Convoluting Federal Supremacy (Phase I)," hereinafter referred to as the "Affidavit." This document was served upon 251 named defendants, respondents, and CC'd parties, including private individuals, Lancaster County officials (judges, non-judges, Domestic Relations staff, and Magisterial District Judges), federal officials (e.g., FBI Special Agent Wayne A. Jacobs), state officials (e.g., Governor Josh Shapiro, Secretary of State Al Schmidt, Attorney General David Sunday, and Commissioner Christopher Paris of the Pennsylvania State Police), Pennsylvania Supreme Court System personnel (Superior and Supreme Court judges, Disciplinary Board members across Districts I-IV and leadership, Central Intake Counsel, and Judicial Conduct Board members), local officials (e.g., Chiefs Anthony Hall and Jack Brommer), and witnesses/potential future respondents (e.g., state and federal representatives, U.S. Senate and House Judiciary Committees, Pennsylvania Senate and House Judiciary Committees, federal child support oversight committees, and U.S. District Court personnel).
2. Dissemination of the Affidavit was effected via mail, email, fax, and/or hand delivery where applicable, as indicated by the addresses and contact information provided in the document. The Affidavit included a detailed Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) and Pennsylvania Right-to-Know Law (RTKL) request, demanding production of specific records such as State Plans, cooperative agreements, financial records, contracts, oaths of office, bonds, organizational charts, handbooks, incentive payment schedules, and related materials pertaining to Title IV-D child support programs. Respondents were afforded 30 days to respond fully, with the deadline expiring on January 27, 2026.
3. The Affidavit explicitly warned that failure to respond within the allotted time would constitute default, willful obstruction, and acquiescence by silence to all claims therein, including allegations of treason, sedition, racketeering, human trafficking, money laundering, fraud, and systematic deprivation of constitutional rights under Federal Supremacy in family law proceedings.
4. As of January 27, 2026, only three responses were received from the 251 served parties:
 - a. On January 5, 2026, Andrea Bankes, Agency Open Records Officer for the Pennsylvania Department of Human Services (PA DHS), sent an email from ra-dpwrkl@pa.gov providing an "interim response" to RTKL Request 25-DHS-0688. This response included links to two PDFs: one appearing to be a copy of my original RTKL request, and another interim letter extending the response time under 65 P.S. § 67.902(a)(7). However, this interim response did not provide any substantive documents requested, such as the State Plan, cooperative agreements, or financial records, and thus again continues to fail to conform with the Affidavit's demands under FOIA and RTW.
 - b. On January 14, 2026, the Governor's Correspondence Office sent an automated email from pagov@iq.pa.gov stating: "Governor Shapiro is committed to assisting constituents; however, the Governor's Office cannot provide legal advice or legal assistance in any matter." The email directed me to external resources like the Pennsylvania Bar Association and DHS legal help page, without addressing the substantive claims, requests for documents (including the Governor's signed State Plan), or allegations of his role in enabling the alleged racketeering enterprise.

- c. Michelle Henry's OIG office sent an unsigned response from the investigations division, but the PDF was unreadable.
5. No other responses were received from the remaining 248 parties, including all individual judges, elected officials, appointed officials, agencies, and witnesses. Every individual respondent failed to meet the information requests for their personal contracts, oaths, bonds, insurance, job descriptions, or any other demanded materials. Every agency, including but not limited to federal entities (HHS, SSA, FBI), state entities (Supreme Court System, Disciplinary Boards, Judicial Conduct Board), and local entities (Lancaster County Court, Domestic Relations, Magisterial Districts), failed to provide the required documents or rebut the allegations.
6. Due to this widespread non-response, all 251 parties—agencies and individuals alike—have defaulted on their obligations under the Affidavit, FOIA (5 U.S.C. § 552), and RTKL (65 P.S. § 67.101 et seq.). This default constitutes willful obstruction of justice, conspiracy to defraud, and misprision of treason under relevant statutes (e.g., 18 U.S.C. §§ 371, 1505, 2382).
7. By their silence and failure to contest or provide evidence to the contrary, all parties have acquiesced and consented to the facts, claims, and legal conclusions set forth in the Affidavit. This includes admission to the existence of a treasonous interstate racketeering enterprise involving Title IV-D funds, intentional violations of Federal Supremacy, and deprivation of constitutional rights in family law matters. Such acquiescence by silence is recognized in law as binding (e.g., under principles of estoppel and commercial default per UCC § 1-308).
8. The Affidavit was dedicated to Retired Senior Judge William P. Mahon of the Lancaster County Court of Common Pleas, who has presided over my family law matters (Case No. CI-2021-03383, PACSES 8730073) and is the primary judicial actor accused of committing these constitutional violations against me, including but not limited to depriving me of Federal Supremacy, due notice, substantive and procedural due process, equal protection, neutral arbitration, and intentionally employing constitutionally forbidden practices such as generating state-created dangers and attributing blame to me for the resulting outcomes. He does so as an agent for Pennsylvania Supreme Court Chief Justice Debra Todd who personally assigned him to these matters.
9. My wife, Alene Reich, through her attorney Wendy Chan, filed a petition for contempt against me. On November 5, 2025, I filed a Motion to Dismiss with Prejudice Wife's Petition for Contempt, arguing that the underlying support order (issued April 16, 2024, for \$2,806.82 per month plus \$310 in arrears) is unlawful, unconstitutional, and part of a racketeering operation; that I have complied with unconstitutional payments based on ability for safety; that the petition misrepresents income and willfulness; and that it violates federal supremacy, due process, equal protection, anti-peonage laws, and other protections under the U.S. Constitution (e.g., 14th Amendment, 13th Amendment, 18 U.S.C. § 1581 et seq.), as well as Pennsylvania law. Because she chose to issue this contempt order after I disclosed the operations of this cartel I have accused her and her attorney of conspiring with the Cartel in an attempt to get this illegal body to cause me harm.
10. On December 22, 2025, I filed a 2 Pa.C.S.A. § 752 appeal for judicial review in an effort to escape the unlawful administrative jurisdiction of the Domestic Relations Section (DRS) and obtain proper judicial scrutiny to demonstrate the ongoing deprivations in my case.
11. Without holding a hearing or providing me an opportunity to be heard, Judge Mahon dismissed my motion to dismiss contempt, further depriving me of due process and neutral adjudication.
12. On or about January 27, 2026, I received notice from Lancaster DRS that Judge Mahon has scheduled a hearing for March 12, 2026, encompassing both a review of support alleged in response to my 2 PaCSA § 752 appeal and a contempt proceeding related to my wife's petition. I believe this combined scheduling is retaliatory, intended to punish me for reporting Judge Mahon's alleged crimes in the Affidavit and other filings, **and constitutes a gross violation of my right to an impartial tribunal // neutral adjudication.**

13. Judge Mahon's continued involvement in my case, despite being directly accused and dedicated as the subject of the Affidavit exposing his alleged treasonous actions, followed by his default, creates an irreconcilable conflict of interest and bias, violating my rights to fundamental fairness and neutral arbitration under the 14th Amendment. His silence and default admits these facts.
14. I have no objection to adjudication by any judge who will abide by Federal Supremacy and uphold my constitutional rights; my claims are not an attack on all judges but specifically on those who willfully violate the Constitution in family law matters. I herein invoke a lot of judges that are engaged in family law, but I have intentionally refrained from targeting judges that focus on commercial or criminal law in their state court practice.
15. On October 21, 2025, I emailed the Lancaster DRS at DROsupportinfo@PACSES.COM, requesting the total amount of monies seized or garnished from me and the amount distributed to my wife, Alene Reich, under PACSES 8730073. This was to investigate suspected mismatches in Title IV-D funds between the money "collected" from me and disbursed to her.
16. On November 1, 2025, after 10 days of no response—exceeding the 5-day timeframe for such routine information under the Cooperative Agreement between DHS, DRS, and Lancaster County (§3.5 Case Record Standards; §4.4 Enumeration of Supportive Services)—I followed up, escalating to a FOIA/RTKL request. I demanded an unredacted Cooperative Agreement for Lancaster, the State Plan, and all contracts touching Title IV-D monies, including incentives.
17. As of January 27, 2026—three months later—Lancaster DRS has failed to respond, constituting default, obstruction (18 U.S.C. § 1505), and acquiescence. I filed criminal complaints. This silence amid my explicit fraud concerns (e.g., \$280K billed, \$240K extorted, unknown distributed) admits to mismatches/theft (§3.3 Remittance), furthering the cartel's laundering (18 U.S.C. § 1956).
18. These facts are submitted as probable cause for further investigation, civil and criminal proceedings, and remedies against the defaulting parties, including immediate recusal of Judge Mahon and voiding of all unconstitutional orders in my case. I reserve the right to amend or supplement this affidavit as new information arises.

THE BLACK COLLAR CARTEL OPERATION

(Layman Version)

Imagine a hidden machine that's designed to look like it's helping families but is actually rigged to hurt dads, steal money, and break up homes—all while making cash for the government. There exists a sinister step-by-step system built on contracts, laws, and malevolent choices by people in power. I'll break it down plainly, starting from the top and working down to what happens in courtrooms. The goal? - When a mom applies for child support (even if she's not on welfare), the dad is automatically roped into the system through the local Domestic Relations Section (DRS). No choice, no questions—boom, you're in.

Step 3: Judges Become Revenue Collectors, Not Fair Referees

- Judges aren't just neutral decision-makers here; they're part of the contract chain. Through these state and county deals, they act more like "revenue commissioners" focused on bringing in money than real judges protecting rights. It's kind of like moonlighting as a debt collector while your day job is a judge.
- In court (for things like support, custody, divorce, or protection orders), judges ignore "Federal Supremacy"—that's the rule saying the U.S. Constitution trumps state laws. They skip key protections from the 14th Amendment, like your right to a fair process, equal treatment, and a chance to defend yourself properly.
- Instead, judges often:
 - Block dads from presenting evidence or objections that could help their case.

This comprehensive analysis exposes a **treasonous interstate racketeering enterprise**—dubbed the **"Black Collar Cartel"**—operating under the guise of the Title IV-D child support system in Pennsylvania and nationwide. Far from a benign family support mechanism, this cartel systematically deprives fathers of **fundamental constitutional rights** through a meticulously layered contractual scheme that prioritizes revenue generation over justice, fairness, and familial integrity. While the system masquerades as compliant with state statutes like **23 Pa.C.S. § 4301 et seq.** (support duties) and **23 Pa.C.S. § 4352** (enforcement), it flagrantly flouts **Federal Supremacy (U.S. Const. art. VI, cl. 2)**, enabling a host of high crimes: **human trafficking** via unlawful deprivations of child custody (**18 U.S.C. § 1590; 18 Pa.C.S. § 2904**, interference with custody), **money laundering** through falsified and mismatched Title IV-D fund reports (**18 U.S.C. §§ 1956-1957**), **mail and wire fraud** in the transmission of bogus collection notices and orders (**18 U.S.C. §§ 1341, 1343, 1346** for honest services fraud), **extortion under color of law (18 U.S.C. § 1951; Hobbs Act)**, and **sedition conspiracy** against the constitutional order (**18 U.S.C. § 2384**).

Judges, transformed into de facto **"revenue commissioners"** or **"debt collectors"** through interstate contracts, perpetrate **ultra vires acts**—actions beyond their lawful jurisdiction—resulting in **void ab initio orders** that impose **peonage and involuntary servitude (18 U.S.C. § 1581; 13th Amendment; United States v. Murphy** (non-oppressive support), **SS v. KF** (non-punitive), **Nischal** (protections for husband), **Bishop v. Bishop** (non-retaliatory), **Edelstein v. Edelstein** (dignity of life), **Yeats v. Yeats** (non-confiscatory), and **Roviello v. Roviello** (equitable, non-punitive allocations).

The cartel's operations hide in plain sight, simulating statutory compliance while omitting constitutional safeguards, leading to **asymmetric outcomes** where fathers' evidence and objections are routinely blocked (**Hovey v. Elliott, 167 U.S. 409 (1897)**, no denial of defense for contempt), and mothers' requests—even those inflating income or demanding unequal custody—are granted without scrutiny (**Doe v. Purdue University, 928 F.3d 652 (7th Cir. 2019)**, equal protection in biased proceedings). This analysis dissects the scheme step-by-step, integrating violations across the full legal hierarchy: from Biblical precepts to federal and state constitutions, codes, regulations, case law, court rules, commercial law principles (treating support orders as negotiable instruments under **13 Pa.C.S. § 3104**), and interstate contractual obligations. **Mahon's recent actions** exemplifies the cartel's tactics: no hearing on contempt dismissal, retaliatory contempt scheduling, and orders ignoring ability to pay, all while skirting Federal Supremacy, misrepresenting income and willfulness, and no custody is allowed until child support extortion is smoothly operating.

Biblical Preamble: Moral Foundation for Justice and the Roots of Constitutional Protections

At its core, the Black Collar Cartel offends ancient **Biblical mandates** that form the moral bedrock of American jurisprudence, as recognized in **Public Law 97-280** (designating 1983 as the "Year of the Bible" and affirming Biblical teachings as foundational to U.S. law). **Exodus 22:22-23** explicitly prohibits afflicting

widows and the fatherless, commanding: "Ye shall not afflict any widow, or fatherless child. If thou afflict them in any wise, and they cry at all unto me, I will surely hear their cry." Yet, the cartel weaponizes family courts to effectively orphan children from fit, loving fathers for financial gain, severing paternal bonds under the pretext of "**best interest**" standards that ignore presumptions of fitness (**Stanley v. Illinois, 405 U.S. 645 (1972)**). **Deuteronomy 24:17** demands impartial justice for the vulnerable: "Thou shalt not pervert the judgment of the stranger, nor of the fatherless; nor take a widow's raiment to pledge." **Psalm 82:3-4** enjoins: "Defend the poor and fatherless: do justice to the afflicted and needy. Deliver the poor and needy: rid them out of the hand of the wicked." **Proverbs 31:8-9** commands advocacy for the voiceless: "Open thy mouth for the dumb in the cause of all such as are appointed to destruction. Open thy mouth, judge righteously, and plead the cause of the poor and needy." These imperatives are perverted by extortionate support orders that confiscate earnings beyond sustainability, leaving fathers destitute and unable to maintain dignity or family ties—directly contravening Pennsylvania precedents like **Murphy v. Murphy** (support must be non-confiscatory and allow a dignified life), **SS v. KF** (non-punitive and non-oppressive), and **Bishop v. Bishop** (non-retaliatory protections for the obligor husband).

This Biblical framework echoes in the **Declaration of Independence's** invocation of unalienable rights endowed by the Creator, which the cartel subverts through racketeering (**18 U.S.C. § 1961 et seq.**; **H.J. Inc. v. Northwestern Bell Telephone Co., 492 U.S. 229 (1989)**, establishing pattern requirements for ongoing criminal acts; **Sedima v. Imrex Co., 473 U.S. 479 (1985)**, enabling civil RICO claims for fraud victims; **Reves v. Ernst & Young, 507 U.S. 170 (1993)**, defining participation in the enterprise). By enabling daily deprivations that treat fathers as economic chattel, the system commits moral treason against these foundational principles, manifesting in legal violations that render orders void for fraud (**United States v. Throckmorton, 98 U.S. 61 (1878)**; **Hazel-Atlas Glass Co. v. Hartford-Empire Co., 322 U.S. 238 (1944)**; **Throckmorton v. Holt, 180 U.S. 552 (1901)**, all holding fraud vitiates judgments).

Step 1: Federal Funding and Incentives – Violations at the National Level

The cartel's foundation lies in federal agencies like **HHS** and **SSA**, which administer Title IV-D under **42 U.S.C. § 651 et seq.** (Social Security Act, as amended by **Public Law 93-647**, the Child Support Enforcement Amendments of 1974). This authorizes grants to states for enforcement (**45 C.F.R. § 304.20**, availability of funding), with performance-based incentives tied to collection metrics (**45 C.F.R. § 305.33**; **42 U.S.C. § 658a**, incentive payments). However, this creates a **perverse bounty system** that subverts the Supremacy Clause by encouraging states to prioritize revenue over constitutional protections, leading to fraudulent over-collections and misrepresentations (**18 U.S.C. § 1001**, false statements to federal agencies; **31 U.S.C. § 3729**, False Claims Act liability for inflated claims). Funds are disbursed without rigorous oversight, enabling downstream deprivations where fathers face incarceration for nonpayment without ability-to-pay hearings (**Turner v. Rogers, 564 U.S. 431 (2011)**, mandating safeguards against erroneous deprivation in civil contempt).

Federal Constitution: The scheme breaches multiple amendments. State courts start by intentionally skirting Federal Supremacy and act more like **despotic tyrants** than lawful adjudicators. They ignore Federal Case law and skip landmark decisions like **Mathews v. Eldridge** requiring a **Mathews Balancing Test** resulting in the need for **strict scrutiny** and **Compelling State Interests** when Fundamental Liberties are involved. The **1st Amendment** protects free speech and petition rights, yet retaliation for challenging orders (e.g., user's motion dismissed without hearing) violates **Hartman v. Moore, 547 U.S. 250 (2006)**. The **5th Amendment's** due process and takings clauses are offended by pre-seizure wage garnishments without hearings (**Fuentes v. Shevin, 407 U.S. 67 (1972)**). The **13th Amendment** prohibits slavery and involuntary servitude, directly implicated in debt-based coercion (**United States v. Dann, 873 F.2d 1189 (9th Cir. 1989)**; **United States v. Kozminski**). The **14th Amendment's** due process (procedural and substantive) and equal protection clauses are systematically ignored, as fathers endure

biased enforcement without neutral tribunals (**Mathews v. Eldridge**, 424 U.S. 319 (1976), balancing private interest, government interest, and error risk; **Goldberg v. Kelly**, 397 U.S. 254 (1970), pre-termination hearings for welfare; **Village of Willowbrook v. Olech**, 528 U.S. 562 (2000), protection for "class of one"; **Brown v. Board of Education**, 347 U.S. 483 (1954), applied to family law biases; **Reed v. Reed**, 404 U.S. 71 (1971), gender discrimination in estates; **Orr v. Orr**, 440 U.S. 268 (1979), gender-neutral alimony; **Mississippi University for Women v. Hogan**, 458 U.S. 718 (1982), prohibiting gender stereotypes in education, extendable to family law). Note **Quilloin v. Walcott** states verbatim that "State's interest in caring for the children is **"de minimis"** if the father is in fact a fit parent." Thus, when fit parents are involved there is no compelling state interest and family law orders abridging fundamental rights and liberties of fit parents are **void ab initio** and these intentionally unconstitutional orders are thus signed confessions of treason, sedition, and many felonies; simulating law, rather than lawful court orders.

States, enticed by federal incentives, submit and governors sign "**State Plans**" for approval (**42 U.S.C. § 654; 45 C.F.R. § 302.10**), which in Pennsylvania cascade into cooperative agreements with every county's **Domestic Relations Section (DRS)** and **Court of Common Pleas** (attached 2020-2025 Cooperative Agreement Under Title IV-D, **§ 1.1** general purpose to "administer and optimize" enforcement; **§ 2.1** DRS as local IV-D agency). These agreements, signed by county commissioners and court presidents, lock in the cartel by binding judicial actors to revenue goals while paying lip service to judicial independence (**§ 1.2**). Governor **Josh Shapiro's** signature on Pennsylvania's State Plan enables RICO predicates (**18 U.S.C. § 1964** for civil remedies), as funds flow without ensuring constitutional compliance, leading to unconstitutional orders that fail Federal Supremacy are worse still as oppressive orders that violate state substantive rights to non-confiscatory, non-punitive support (**Murphy v. Murphy**, emphasizing support must allow obligor a dignified life without oppression; **SS v. KF**, non-punitive and non-retaliatory; **Nischal**, protections for husband against excessive burdens; **Bishop v. Bishop**, non-retaliatory and equitable; **Edelstein v. Edelstein**, preserving dignity; **Yeats v. Yeats**, non-confiscatory amounts; **Roviello v. Roviello**, non-punitive allocations protecting the obligor).

Pennsylvania Constitution: The cartel breaches **Art. I, § 1** (inherent rights to life, liberty, property, including parental upbringing); **§ 11** (open courts for redress of injuries, yet pro se fathers face barriers; **Pa. Const. Art. I, § 11**); **§ 26** (no discrimination by Commonwealth, extending to gender biases in family law); **55 Pa. Code § 3140.21** (due process in family services, ignored in expedited proceedings).

Pennsylvania Code: Support statutes like **23 Pa.C.S. §§ 4301** (duties of support), **4352** (continuing enforcement), **5328** (custody factors), **6107** (PFA hearings) are applied mechanically, ignoring supremacy and leading to deprivations (**Com. v. Criminal codes are implicated: **18 Pa.C.S. §§ 903** (criminal conspiracy in the enterprise), **2701** (assault via coercive orders), **2709** (harassment through repeated enforcement), **2901** (kidnapping of children via unequal custody), **2904** (custody interference), **3921** (theft by unlawful taking of property/income), **4902** (perjury in affidavits), **4952** (intimidation of witnesses/fathers), **5101** (obstructing administration of law), **5105** (hindering apprehension of cartel members), **5301** (official oppression by judges/officials).

Pennsylvania Regulations: 55 Pa. Code § 187.21 et seq. requires cooperation but omits due process safeguards, allowing unequal protection.

At the county level, cooperative agreements (previously attached PDF, **§ 9** explicitly affirming Federal Supremacy and requiring compliance with federal laws/regulations, yet routinely avoided; **§ 2.2** enumerating Title IV-D services; **§ 3.13** provision of legal services) designate DRS as local IV-D agencies, binding judges to administrative revenue roles while claiming independence (**§ 1.2**). Judges omit **14th Amendment** protections, issuing void orders that deprive parental, religious, and property rights asymmetrically—favoring mothers by blocking fathers' evidence/objections (**Hovey v. Elliott**) while granting inflated requests (ie my **\$2,806.82/month** order exceeding ability, per motion). This creates "**state-created dangers**" (**DeShaney v. Winnebago County, 489 U.S. 189 (1989)**, liability for endangering litigants then punishing responses) and violates substantive rights to non-confiscatory support that preserves dignity and avoids oppression (**Murphy v. Murphy**: "Support orders must not be confiscatory or oppressive, allowing the obligor a reasonable standard of living"; **SS v. KF**: non-punitive and non-retaliatory; **Nischal**: protections for husband against undue burdens; **Bishop v. Bishop**: non-retaliatory, ensuring fairness; **Edelstein v. Edelstein**: preserving "dignity of life" for obligor; **Yeats v. Yeats**: non-confiscatory amounts; **Roviello v. Roviello**: equitable, non-punitive distributions protecting the husband; **Ball v. Minnick, 414 N.W.2d 180 (Minn. Ct. App. 1987)**, obligations not punishment; **Ettinger v. Ettinger, 637 P.2d 9 (Colo. 1981)**, equal custody for fit parents; **Sinclair v. Sinclair, 196 Kan. 667 (1966)**, equitable divorce distribution).

Interstate Contractual Obligations: The agreement's **§ 9** mandate for Supremacy is breached, rendering actions **ultra vires** (**Cooper v. Aaron, 358 U.S. 1 (1958)**, states bound by federal law); judges lose immunity for malicious/administrative acts (**Bradley v. Fisher, 80 U.S. 335 (1871)**; **Forrester v. White, 484 U.S. 219 (1988)**; **Mireles v. Waco, 502 U.S. 9 (1991)**; **Stump v. Sparkman, 435 U.S. 349 (1978)**; **Randall v. Brigham, 74 U.S. 523 (1869)**; **Ex parte Virginia, 100 U.S. 339 (1880)**, no immunity for discrimination; **Pulliam v. Pachtman, 424 U.S. 409 (1976)**, limited prosecutorial immunity; **28 U.S.C. § 455**, judicial disqualification for bias). Contracts form RICO enterprise (**§ 3.3** remittance of collections, enabling fraud).

Federal/PA Violations in Practice: Orders ignore **Turner** (incarceration safeguards); violate anti-peonage (**13th Amendment**; **Bailey v. Alabama**); treat as negotiable instruments without defenses (**13 Pa.C.S. § 3305**; **UCC § 3-305**); **Doe v. Purdue** (equal protection); **Smith v. Barry, 985 F.2d 180 (4th Cir. 1993)** (access to courts); **Walton v. Arizona, 497 U.S. 639 (1990)** (due process in sentencing); **Com. v. Haigh** (PFA misuse).

Step 4: Wives and Attorneys as Co-Conspirators in the Harm

Wives and their attorneys initiate the cycle by filing petitions that exploit the biased system, often misrepresenting facts like income or willfulness (wife's petition ignores compliance based on ability, constituting perjury under **18 U.S.C. § 1621** and **18 Pa.C.S. § 4902**). They act as co-conspirators, aiding the cartel by requesting unconstitutional relief, knowing judges will grant it to sustain ill-gotten revenue.

Violations: Aiding/abetting RICO (**18 U.S.C. § 1962(d)**); accessory after fact (**§ 3**); **PA Const. Art. I § 26** (discrimination); **Pa.R.C.P. 1910.19** (modification requires changed circumstances, ignored); **Kramer v. Caribbean Mills, 394 U.S. 823 (1969)** (forum non conveniens in collusive suits); **Restatement (Second) of Contracts § 208** (unconscionable terms void).

Step 5: Enforcement by Law Enforcement – Self-Protecting Loop and Predicate Acts

Sheriffs, police, DAs, and the state AG are integrated via intergovernmental agreements (§ 3.13), enforcing void orders through arrests, seizures, and incarcerations—committing RICO predicates like kidnapping (18 U.S.C. § 1201; 18 Pa.C.S. § 2901) and theft (18 Pa.C.S. § 3921). This loop protects the cartel, as judges oversee enforcement, hindering investigations (18 Pa.C.S. § 5105).

Violations: 4th Amendment unreasonable seizures (*Tennessee v. Lane*, 541 U.S. 509 (2004)); *Silvestri v. General Motors Corp.*, 271 F.3d 583 (4th Cir. 2001) (spoliation of evidence in cover-ups); *Zubulake v. UBS Warburg LLC*, 229 F.R.D. 422 (S.D.N.Y. 2004) (sanctions for destruction); *In re D.A.*, 801 A.2d 614 (Pa. Super. 2002) (due process in enforcement actions).

Step 6: Oversight Failure – Compromised Watchdogs and Systemic Cover-Up

Oversight entities like **Judicial Conduct Boards** and appeals courts, incentivized by the same funds, fail to act on complaints (45 C.F.R. § 303.35 audits unenforced; 18 U.S.C. § 2382 misprision of treason; 18 Pa.C.S. § 5101 obstruction). Appeals rubber-stamp deprivations, perpetuating the cycle (*Younger v. Harris* abstention abused).

Violations: *United States v. Kozminski* (servitude); *Com. v. Bolden* (mandates ignored); 42 Pa.C.S. § 2171 (judicial oversight dereliction).

Substantive Rights in Pennsylvania Child Support Obligations: Protections Against Confiscatory, Oppressive, Punitive, and Retaliatory Orders

Child support orders in Pennsylvania, as administered through the **Title IV-D system** and local Domestic Relations Sections (DRS), are generally unconstitutional on their face due to the intentional evasion of **Federal Supremacy** (U.S. Const. art. VI, cl. 2). The process systematically disregards the **Mathews v. Eldridge** balancing test (424 U.S. 319 (1976)), which requires weighing the private interest affected (e.g., a father's property, parental rights, and liberty), the risk of erroneous deprivation through the procedures used, and the government's interest in fiscal efficiency. In family law contexts, where fundamental rights like parental autonomy (*Troxel v. Granville*, 530 U.S. 57 (2000)) and property (*Fuentes v. Shevin*, 407 U.S. 67 (1972) & *Van Horne's Lessee v. Dorrance*, 2 U.S. (2 Dall.) 304 (C.C.D. Pa. 1795)) are at stake, **strict scrutiny** applies: The state must demonstrate a **compelling governmental interest** (e.g., child safety/welfare) and that the means are narrowly tailored (*Roe v. Wade*, 410 U.S. 113 (1973), privacy rights analysis, though overruled, its scrutiny framework persists; *Wisconsin v. Yoder*, 406 U.S. 205 (1972), religious and parental freedoms). However, Pennsylvania's support guidelines (**Pa.R.C.P. 1910.16 et seq.**) and enforcement (23 Pa.C.S. § 4352) rarely articulate—let alone prove—a compelling state interest beyond revenue generation, instead presuming obligations without individualized hearings or rebuttal opportunities (*Turner v. Rogers*, 564 U.S. 431 (2011), requiring safeguards against erroneous nonpayment findings). This renders orders **void ab initio**, as they fail to provide due notice, substantive/procedural due process, equal protection, or neutral arbitration, often generating **"state-created dangers"** (*DeShaney v. Winnebago County*, 489 U.S. 189 (1989)) by provoking financial ruin and then punishing the fallout.

The judge in the instant case (**Retired Senior Cartel Racketeer William P. Mahon**) exemplified this evasion by arguing that § 1.2 of the Cooperative Agreement Under Title IV-D ("Independence of the Judiciary Guaranteed") exempts support determinations from Federal Supremacy, claiming the agreement does not "enlarge or reduce the jurisdiction of the Court" or "encroach upon the independence of the judiciary." This interpretation is legally flawed: § 1.2 cannot override the Supremacy Clause, as cooperative agreements and other intrastate and interstate contracts are subordinate to federal law (45

C.F.R. § 302.10; Cooper v. Aaron, 358 U.S. 1 (1958), states, particularly through interstate contracts, cannot nullify federal mandates). Moreover, **§ 9** of the same agreement explicitly affirms Federal Supremacy, requiring compliance with federal statutes and regulations. By prioritizing judicial "independence" to ignore constitutional scrutiny, the process perpetuates a simulation of law, depriving alleged obligors of protections like the Mathews test and strict scrutiny, without ever justifying a compelling interest beyond incentivized collections (**42 U.S.C. § 658a**), which are consistently deemed "not of the highest order" and not a compelling state interest. This scheme is repugnant to law.

Whereas in a limited number of cases a father may incur duty, breach, and damages against a state by wilfully not providing for his children resulting in wife and children relying on state benefits for private financial problems, this is a minority of cases in the modern era. Fathers are often willing, able, and actively supporting their children, no state aid is used or no state aid is required, but the state still acts like they have standing and a compelling state interest where none exists.

If, however, by some extraordinary set of facts or circumstances, a support order were deemed allowable under Federal Supremacy—perhaps in a rare case where a compelling state interest is proven and narrowly tailored—then a separate layer of substantive rights under Pennsylvania law comes into play for alleged obligors. These rights ensure that obligations are fair, reasonable, and attuned to the obligor's financial realities, stemming from Pennsylvania Superior Court and Supreme Court precedents that emphasize **non-confiscatory** (not stripping all resources), **non-oppressive** (allowing basic living standards), **non-punitive** (not as punishment), **non-retaliatory** (free from bias), and protective of dignity and self-sufficiency. The purpose of child support is solely the child's welfare, not parental penalty (**23 Pa.C.S. § 4301 et seq.; Pa.R.C.P. 1910.16 et seq.**), balanced with the obligor's rights under the Pennsylvania Constitution (**Pa. Const. Art. I, § 1**, inherent rights to property and liberty).

A foundational case is **Commonwealth ex rel. Yeats v. Yeats, 208 Pa. Super. 275, 222 A.2d 451 (1966)**, where the Superior Court held that "[t]he amount of the order for support must be fair and not a confiscatory burden upon a parent. The purpose is the support and welfare of the child, not the punishment of the parent." This underscores proportionate orders based on earning capacity, not impoverishment.

Similarly, **Murphy v. Murphy, 410 Pa. Super. 146, 599 A.2d 647 (1991)**, addressed excessive alimony pendente lite and child support, remanding for recalculation to avoid confiscatory hardship on the husband, ensuring retention of resources for dignified living.

In **Nischal v. Nischal, 875 A.2d 371 (Pa. Super. 2005)**, the Superior Court vacated a \$498 monthly order, emphasizing non-oppressive calculations considering the husband's realities, preventing retaliatory or punitive effects from marital disputes.

Commonwealth ex rel. Bishop v. Bishop, 234 Pa. Super. 600, 341 A.2d 153 (1975), stressed non-retaliatory and non-punitive principles in retroactive support, ensuring fairness for the husband without vindictiveness.

Edelstein v. Edelstein, 399 Pa. Super. 536, 582 A.2d 1074 (1990), affirmed support preserving the obligor's "dignity of life," requiring non-confiscatory balances allowing self-sufficiency without oppression.

S.S. v. K.F., 189 A.3d 1093 (Pa. Super. 2018), in a high-income context, held deviations must avoid "punitive or confiscatory" awards, vacating an excessive order and remanding for non-retaliatory recalculation based on the father's circumstances.

Commonwealth ex rel. Roviello v. Roviello, 229 Pa. Super. 428, 323 A.2d 766 (1974), reinforced non-punitive orders: "The purpose of a support order is to determine a reasonable allowance for the support of the children, consistent with the father's station in life and accustomed standard of living," focusing on welfare over retribution.

Additional cases further protect fathers: **Colonna v. Colonna**, 855 A.2d 648 (Pa. 2004) (Supreme Court), rebuttable high-income guidelines to avoid punitive overpayments, tailored to needs without oppression. **Hanrahan v. Bakker**, 186 A.3d 958 (Pa. 2018), non-confiscatory/punitive in high-income cases, safeguarding against retaliatory escalations. **King v. King**, 889 A.2d 630 (Pa. Super. 2005), non-retaliatory modifications, preventing vindictive increases. **Commonwealth ex rel. Hagans v. Hagans**, 411 Pa. Super. 242, 601 A.2d 327 (1992), non-oppressive support allowing self-support. **Litmans v. Litmans**, 449 Pa. Super. 209, 673 A.2d 382 (1996), non-punitive, not as alimony substitutes or fault penalties. **Egelman v. Egelman**, 728 A.2d 380 (Pa. Super. 1999), reasonable needs without excess, protecting dignity. **Portugal v. Portugal**, 798 A.2d 246 (Pa. Super. 2002), non-confiscatory in high-income, rebuttable to avoid burdens. **Bulgarelli v. Bulgarelli**, 934 A.2d 107 (Pa. Super. 2007), guidelines rebuttable against oppression. **Branch v. Jackson**, 427 Pa. Super. 417, 629 A.2d 170 (1993), father's earning capacity considered to prevent punitive orders. **Knorr v. Knorr**, 527 Pa. 83, 588 A.2d 503 (1991), equitable support avoiding hardship on obligor.

Collectively, these precedents establish substantive rights for "obligors" to equitable, non-confiscatory orders protective of dignity. Violations—common in Title IV-D—render orders appealable or voidable (**Pa. Const. Art. I, § 11; 23 Pa.C.S. § 4352**). All of these substantive rights are unlawfully ignored by Senior Retired Racketeer Mahon in the instant matters, and housed in a larger failure of Federal Supremacy.

Absence of a Compelling State Interest in Defrauding Fathers for Title IV-D Child Support Reimbursements

In U.S. constitutional law, a "**compelling state interest**" (also known as a compelling governmental interest) is a critical component of the **strict scrutiny test**, the most rigorous standard of judicial review applied when government actions infringe upon fundamental rights, such as the parental rights protected under the **Due Process Clause** of the **Fourteenth Amendment**, or involve suspect classifications like race. This standard requires the government to prove two elements: (1) that the action serves a compelling interest, meaning one that is **essential, necessary, or crucial** to government functions—far exceeding mere legitimacy, importance, preference, or convenience—and (2) that the means employed are **narrowly tailored** to achieve that interest using the **least restrictive alternatives** available. The U.S. Supreme Court has not provided a universal, exhaustive definition of what qualifies as "compelling," instead evaluating it on a case-by-case basis, but it has consistently described such interests as those "**of the highest order**" that are vital to societal welfare, such as national security, preserving public safety on a large scale, remedying documented past discrimination with strong evidence, or preventing imminent harm that cannot be addressed otherwise. Interests that are merely administrative, fiscal, or discretionary—such as preventing fraudulent claims without evidence of widespread fraud or promoting efficiency—do not meet this threshold, as seen in **Sherbert v. Verner**, 374 U.S. 398 (1963), where the Court held that a state's interest in avoiding fraudulent unemployment claims was insufficient to burden religious exercise. Similarly, in **Wisconsin v. Yoder**, 406 U.S. 205 (1972), the Court ruled that a state's interest in mandatory education until age 16 was not compelling enough to override Amish parents' religious and parental rights, emphasizing that only interests "**of the highest order and those not otherwise served**" can justify such abridgements of fundamental liberties.

Parental rights are among the most fundamental liberties protected by the Constitution, encompassing the right to direct the care, custody, upbringing, and education of one's children without undue state

interference (**Meyer v. Nebraska**, 262 U.S. 390 (1923); **Pierce v. Society of Sisters**, 268 U.S. 510 (1925); **Prince v. Massachusetts**, 321 U.S. 158 (1944); **Parham v. J.R.**, 442 U.S. 584 (1979)). For fit parents, this interest is paramount, and the state must presume their fitness absent clear and convincing evidence to the contrary (**Stanley v. Illinois**, 405 U.S. 645 (1972); **Santosky v. Kramer**, 455 U.S. 745 (1982), requiring clear and convincing proof for terminating parental rights due to the commanding private interest at stake). In **Troxel v. Granville**, 530 U.S. 57 (2000), the Supreme Court held that the state lacks a compelling interest in second-guessing a fit parent's decisions regarding third-party visitation, as such interference violates due process without allegations of unfitness. Extending this principle, **Quilloin v. Walcott**, 434 U.S. 246 (1978), explicitly states that the "[s]tate's interest in caring for the children is 'de minimis' if the father is in fact a fit parent," underscoring that routine state involvement in intact or fit parental arrangements is minimal and cannot justify burdens on fundamental rights. Courts have also struck down child support-related mandates under equal protection when they discriminatorily burden certain parents (e.g., divorced vs. intact families) without a rational basis, let alone a compelling interest, as in **Webb v. Sowell**, 692 S.E.2d 543 (S.C. 2010), where requiring only non-intact parents to fund college expenses was deemed unconstitutional.

Title IV-D of the Social Security Act (**42 U.S.C. § 651 et seq.**) establishes a federal-state contractual partnership for child support enforcement, providing incentives and reimbursements to states for collections, primarily to recoup public assistance costs like **TANF** (Temporary Assistance for Needy Families). However, when applied to defraud fit fathers—through inflated, unnecessary, or fraudulent support orders where no state aid is involved or required—the program's revenue-driven mechanisms do not constitute a compelling state interest. First, the core purpose of Title IV-D is to enforce support obligations to reduce welfare expenditures, not to generate profit or impose obligations absent actual state financial involvement (**45 C.F.R. §§ 302.10, 302.56, 303.8**, emphasizing fair administration, rebuttable guidelines, and periodic reviews). In cases involving fit fathers who are willing and able to support their children privately, without reliance on public benefits, the state's interest in "reimbursement" evaporates, rendering it de minimis at best (**Quilloin v. Walcott**; **Troxel v. Granville**; **In re M.S.**, recognizing fit parents' fundamental liberty to control child-rearing without state intrusion). Pursuing collections solely for federal incentives (e.g., up to \$2 for every \$3 spent on enforcement) transforms the system into a revenue scheme, which courts have rejected as non-compelling, akin to administrative convenience in **Sherbert** or educational mandates in **Yoder**. Moreover, defrauding fathers—via misrepresented income, ignored ability-to-pay, or coercive orders—violates equal protection by treating non-intact families differently without justification, as in **Webb**, and fails narrow tailoring, as less restrictive means (e.g., voluntary agreements or actual welfare recoupment) exist. Thus, such practices do not meet the compelling interest standard, rendering associated orders **void ab initio** and exposing officials to liability under **42 U.S.C. § 1983** for rights deprivations.

These are judges. They know this. That's why their signed "orders" are confessions of treason, sedition, wire fraud, mail fraud, and a litany of other crimes in a simulation of law. mens rea exists when unconstitutional acts are performed by a judge under both constitutional and contractual obligation to affirm federal supremacy. These are not lawful and constitutional orders in family law. They are crimes effectuating a racket by way of daily acts of treason and sedition.

MY SPECIFIC MATTERS

Application to My Case: Five Years of Documented Deprivation and Harms

To the black-robed tyrants and their bureaucratic enablers: My personal ordeal stands as irrefutable proof of the Black Collar Cartel's operations—a five-year saga of systemic treason, racketeering, and constitutional sabotage orchestrated by Retired Senior Racketeer William P. Mahon acting as personal agent for Pennsylvania Supreme Court Chief Justice Debra Todd, and along with other judicial and official cohorts in Lancaster County. As a fit parent, documented by psychological evaluations in 2021, acknowledgments from Judge Christopher Hackman, and even Mahon's own rulings conceding my fitness while unlawfully abridging my rights, I have been subjected to a cascade of void ab initio orders that evade Federal Supremacy. These orders fail the *Mathews v. Eldridge* balancing test (424 U.S. 319 (1976)), which demands assessment of the private interest (my parental liberty, property, and dignity), the high risk of erroneous deprivation in biased proceedings, and the government's fiscal interest—here, mere revenue extraction under Title IV-D incentives (42 U.S.C. § 658a). Since these abridge substantive fundamental rights (*Troxel v. Granville*, 530 U.S. 57 (2000), parental autonomy as a liberty interest), strict scrutiny applies: The state must prove a compelling interest (child welfare) narrowly tailored without less restrictive means (*Wisconsin v. Yoder*, 406 U.S. 205 (1972); *Roe v. Wade*, 410 U.S. 113 (1973), framework persisting post-overruling). Yet, Mahon and his ilk apply at best rational basis scrutiny—or more accurately, judicial whim—ignoring these (Pa. Const. Art. I, § 1 inherent rights; 23 Pa.C.S. § 4352 enforcement without scrutiny; Pa.R.C.P. 1910.16 guidelines mechanically applied), perpetuating human trafficking (18 U.S.C. § 1590; 18 Pa.C.S. § 2901 kidnapping), extortion (18 U.S.C. § 1951 Hobbs Act; 18 Pa.C.S. § 3921 theft), fraud (18 U.S.C. §§ 1341 mail, 1343 wire, 1346 honest services; 18 Pa.C.S. § 4902 perjury), and sedition (18 U.S.C. § 2384). Biblically, this offends Exodus 22:22-23 (no afflicting fatherless), Deuteronomy 24:17 (impartial justice), and Proverbs 31:8-9 (advocate for voiceless), perverting divine equity (Public Law 97-280 affirming Biblical foundations).

Mahon, the primary perpetrator dedicated in Phase I as the epitome of "Convoluting Federal Supremacy" for his toddler-like grasp of law, has presided over my matters (CI-2021-03383, PACSES 8730073 and others) with blatant bias, dismissing motions without hearings (*Cleveland Bd. of Educ. v. Loudermill*, 470 U.S. 532 (1985), pre-deprivation due process) and scheduling retaliatory contempt (*Hartman v. Moore*, 547 U.S. 250 (2006), 1st Amendment retaliation; 18 U.S.C. § 1513). His bad-faith claim—that § 1.2 of the Cooperative Agreement ("Independence of the Judiciary Guaranteed") exempts support from supremacy because it neither "enlarges/reduces jurisdiction" nor "encroaches on independence"—is a confession. It tacitly admits supremacy's bind while fabricating escape; § 1.2 is subordinate to the Supremacy Clause, and § 9 explicitly affirms federal compliance (45 C.F.R. § 302.10 state plans; *Blessing v. Freestone*, 520 U.S. 329 (1997)). This breaches contractual good faith (UCC § 1-304; 13 Pa.C.S. § 1304), rendering agreements unconscionable (UCC § 2-302; 13 Pa.C.S. § 2302) and ultra vires (*Bradley v. Fisher*, 80 U.S. 335 (1871); *Forrester v. White*, 484 U.S. 219 (1988); Pa. Const. Art. I, § 11 open courts). Mahon's actions—willful, malicious—strip immunity (*Mireles v. Waco*, 502 U.S. 9 (1991); *Stump v. Sparkman*, 435 U.S. 349 (1978); *Randall v. Brigham*, 74 U.S. 523 (1869); *Ex parte Virginia*, 100 U.S. 339 (1880); *Pulliam v. Allen*, 466 U.S. 522 (1984); *Imbler v. Pachtman*, 424 U.S. 409 (1976); 28 U.S.C. § 455 disqualification; 18 U.S.C. §§ 241-242 deprivation; Pa.R.C.P. 227.1 post-trial relief), exposing him to RICO and his "friends" (18 U.S.C. § 1962; *H.J. Inc. v. Northwestern Bell Tel. Co.*, 492 U.S. 229 (1989); *Sedima v. Imrex Co.*, 473 U.S. 479 (1985); *Reves v. Ernst & Young*, 507 U.S. 170 (1993); *Monell v. Dep't of Soc. Servs.*, 436 U.S. 658 (1978)), treason (18 U.S.C. § 2381), and misprision (18 U.S.C. § 2382; 18 Pa.C.S. § 5301 oppression). Again, tiny statements make for seismic consequences.

What follows is a chronological dissection of my case, drawing from five years of documentation—including PFAs, divorce filings, custody orders, support adjudications, and appeals—serving as probable cause (Duncan v. Louisiana, 391 U.S. 145 (1968), jury rights; Schlib v. Kuebel, 404 U.S. 357 (1971), excessive bail) for investigations, impeachments, and prosecutions (42 U.S.C. § 1983; 18 U.S.C. § 1964 RICO remedies). These acts not only violate my rights but exemplify the cartel's playbook: fraudulent initiations (United States v. Throckmorton, 98 U.S. 61 (1878); Hazel-Atlas Glass Co. v. Hartford-Empire Co., 322 U.S. 238 (1944); Throckmorton v. Holt, 180 U.S. 552 (1901), fraud voids), biased processes (Doe v. Purdue Univ., 928 F.3d 652 (7th Cir. 2019); Reed v. Reed, 404 U.S. 71 (1971); Orr v. Orr, 440 U.S. 268 (1979)), and retaliatory enforcement (18 U.S.C. § 1503 obstruction; § 1505 proceedings; § 1512 tampering; 18 Pa.C.S. § 4952 intimidation; § 5101 obstructing law).

Chronological Timeline of Deprivation

1. **Pre-2021:** I endured 20 years of marriage without any abuse complaints to police or courts (no prior 18 Pa.C.S. § 2701 assault or § 2709 harassment). My wife initiates divorce and demands uneven equitable distribution (23 Pa.C.S. § 3502, but violating property rights under Pa. Const. Art. I, § 1 and 5th Amendment). I refuse, setting the stage for her fraudulent escalations under the cartel's umbrella.
2. **~March 2021:** My wife files PFA with frivolous claims (silent treatment, chalk drawings of love to kids on public sidewalk post-separation—protected 1st Amendment expression; ambiguous "psychotic break" from unclear year). She admits no fear pre-filing (undermining 23 Pa.C.S. § 6102 abuse definition); filed solely to satisfy school custody requirement, not genuine concerns—fraud on the court (18 U.S.C. § 1341; 18 Pa.C.S. § 4902 perjury; Com. v. Haigh, 874 A.2d 1174 (Pa. Super. 2005), PFAs not custody tools).
3. **2021:** A psychologist evaluates me as a fit parent (Stanley v. Illinois, 405 U.S. 645 (1972), fitness presumption). Judge Hackman acknowledges my fitness under "best interest" factors (23 Pa.C.S. § 5328), but this is ignored in later abridgments violating strict scrutiny (Prince v. Massachusetts, 321 U.S. 158 (1944), limited state interest).
4. **April 16, 2024:** Support order issued for \$2,806.82/month plus \$310 in arrears, despite my business losses and compliance based on actual ability (Turner v. Rogers; 45 C.F.R. § 303.8 reviews; non-confiscatory per Yeats v. Yeats, 208 Pa. Super. 275 (1966); Murphy v. Murphy, 410 Pa. Super. 146 (1991)). I am incapable of paying from income without liquidating my dwindling estate, and can no longer make routine mortgage payments.
5. **November 5, 2025:** I file Motion to Dismiss with Prejudice Wife's Petition for Contempt, arguing the order's unconstitutionality (Federal Supremacy evasion), my good-faith payments (42 U.S.C. § 666(a)(9)(C) credits), and the petition's misrepresentations (fraud under UCC § 3-305 defenses; 13 Pa.C.S. § 3305).
6. **December 10, 2025:** New American Funding files for Foreclosure against me after the unlawful, unconstitutional, illegal, and criminal support order renders me incapable of payment (CI-25-09293)
7. **December 22, 2025:** I file 2 Pa.C.S.A. § 752 appeal for judicial review to escape unlawful administrative jurisdiction (ultra vires under Blessing v. Freestone, 520 U.S. 329 (1997)) and demonstrate deprivations, invoking Federal supremacy.
8. **Post-November 2025 (Exact Date Unknown):** Mahon dismisses my motion without a hearing or opportunity to be heard (Goldberg v. Kelly, 397 U.S. 254 (1970); Pa.R.C.P. 1910.27 discovery denied; 14th Amendment procedural due process).

9. **January 27, 2026:** Receive notice of March 12, 2026 hearing combining support review and contempt—clear retaliation for my exposures (Hartman v. Moore; 18 U.S.C. § 1513; Pa. Const. Art. I, § 26 no discrimination).
10. **Ongoing (2021-Present):** Cumulative harms from orders: Lost custody time (trafficking under 18 U.S.C. § 1590), financial ruin leading to mortgage default and foreclosure suit (property theft; 18 Pa.C.S. § 3921; 5th Amendment), emotional/psychological trauma from retaliatory actions (18 Pa.C.S. § 2709 harassment).

Detailed Allegations by Category

Protection from Abuse (PFA): Fraudulent Initiation and Procedural Abuses

My wife's PFA petition was a blatant fraud, timed three months after her divorce initiation and my refusal of her inequitable demands. Despite 20 years without police or court complaints, she cited nonsense: a "silent treatment," loving chalk messages to our kids on public sidewalks (post-separation), and a vague "psychotic break" from an unspecified year. Even if true, these fall short of abuse under 23 Pa.C.S. § 6102 (requiring bodily injury or fear thereof). She admitted pre-filing she wasn't afraid, filing only to satisfy school custody needs—not genuine PFA concerns. This is mail/wire fraud (18 U.S.C. §§ 1341, 1343), perjury (18 Pa.C.S. § 4902), and False Reports (18 PaCS 4906) aiding the cartel via revenue streams.

Racketeer Steadman granted her continuance despite PA law favoring defendants for preparation (23 Pa.C.S. § 6107(a), hearings within 10 days; practice allows defendant continuances for due process). She requested witnesses but never called them, wasting court time. As a fit parent, this abridged my rights without Mathews balancing or strict scrutiny—no compelling interest justified eviscerating my home access and parental role. This facilitated "child abduction" (18 Pa.C.S. § 2904), part of the cartel's human trafficking racket. This case establishes the pattern that zero legitimate reason is enough reason for these corrupt racketeers to ultra vires abridge my fundamental liberties without constitutional protections or restrictions from Federal Supremacy.

Divorce: Unlawful Entrapment and Property Rights Violations

Beyond "equitable distribution" as a constitutional farce violating property rights (Pa. Const. Art. I, § 1; 5th Amendment takings), Mahon's refusal to bifurcate (23 Pa.C.S. § 3323(c.1), keeps me trapped in this legal hell. I have a nearly 4-year-old child with a new partner (post-separation), yet remain legally married—an abomination perpetuating the cartel's control. This prolongs exposure to fraudulent orders, denying my right to petition for redress (1st Amendment) and substantive due process. No compelling interest justifies this; it's judicial whim to maximize Title IV-D incentives.

Custody: Systemic Abridgment of Fit Parent Rights

Every non-shared custody order violates supremacy. As a fit parent—per 2021 psychologist report, Hackman, and Mahon's acknowledgment while abridging—I retain fundamental rights to care/control (Meyer v. Nebraska, 262 U.S. 390 (1923); Troxel). Yet, orders apply "best interest" (23 Pa.C.S. § 5328) under rational scrutiny or whim, ignoring strict scrutiny for abridging substantive liberties. No Mathews test weighs my interest in equal time against the state's revenue motives. This is treasonous deprivation, enabling wife-aided "kidnapping" (18 U.S.C. § 1201).

Support: Extortion, Fraud, and Substantive Rights Violations

Unlawfully assigned as obligor, the calculation extorts non-earned income, violating non-confiscatory rights (Yeats: fair, not confiscatory; Murphy: non-oppressive; S.S. v. K.F.: non-punitive). Mahon rejected my tax return showing large business losses in 2023, resulting in my firing as CEO, paycut, and a multi year series of layoffs—despite my shareholder/board status exempting hearsay (Pa.R.E. 803(6)). He ignored crypto market crashes (2019-2024), sexistly biasing against my industry. This left me below poverty, forcing mortgage default and foreclosure suit. Contempt threatens jail for "arrears" from void orders—peonage (13th Amendment; Bailey). Mahon's §1.2 argument is a bad faith confession: he knows supremacy binds him (§9) but fabricates exemptions to evade it.

These deprivations inflict irreparable harms: lost bonds with children (trafficking), financial ruin (\$41K arrears, home loss), psychological trauma (retaliation via contempt). As Phase I was dedicated to Mahon, this is his "convoluted" legacy—treason. Probable cause demands recusal, voiding/vacating orders, and egregious contempt prosecutions based on state-created dangers.

Mahon's Continued Adjudication: An Abomination of Law and Irreconcilable Conflict

Mahon's insistence on continuing to adjudicate my matters—despite being the dedicated subject of Phase I's exposé, accused of high crimes like treason (18 U.S.C. § 2381), racketeering (18 U.S.C. § 1962), and rights deprivation (18 U.S.C. §§ 241-242)—is an abomination of law, a grotesque miscarriage of justice that shreds any pretense of impartiality (28 U.S.C. § 455; Pa. Code of Jud. Conduct Rule 2.11, disqualification for bias). His admission by silence to these allegations—defaulting on Phase I's demands for oaths, bonds, and rebuttals—constitutes acquiescence (UCC § 1-308 estoppel; principles of commercial default), binding him as complicit in the cartel. This criminal behavior, coupled with his bad-faith supremacy evasion (§1.2 misinterpretation despite §9 affirmation), makes his involvement totally inappropriate, violating due process (14th Amendment; Pa. Const. Art. I, § 11) and neutral arbitration (Goldberg v. Kelly, 397 U.S. 254 (1970)). He should be nowhere near my case; his presence is retaliatory harassment (18 Pa.C.S. § 2709), obstruction (18 U.S.C. § 1505), and further treason, demanding immediate recusal, disbarment, and prosecution. No judge so tainted can wield the gavel without perverting justice.

Detailed Allegations and Evidence: The Cartel's Operations Exposed

To the architects of this treasonous syndicate and their complicit underlings: The Black Collar Cartel is not a mere theory but a documented machine of corruption, fueled by federal dollars and shielded by interstate contracts that pervert justice for profit. This section dismantles the operation layer by layer, drawing from irrefutable evidence—including the attached Lancaster County Cooperative Agreement Under Title IV-D (2020-2025, Grant Number 4100086993, signed by County Commissioners and DHS for CFDA 93.563), which explicitly affirms Federal Supremacy in §9 ("Affirmation of Federal Supremacy") while being twisted to enable ultra vires judicial abuses under §1.2 ("Independence of the Judiciary Guaranteed"). As analyzed earlier, this agreement binds DHS, Lancaster County (150 N Queen Street, Lancaster, PA 17603), and the Court of Common Pleas to federal compliance (45 C.F.R. § 302.10 state plans; 42 U.S.C. § 654), yet it is weaponized to launder funds through fraudulent collections (§3.3 "Remittance of Collections") and enforcement (§3.13 "Provision of Legal Services"), violating good faith obligations (UCC §1-304; 13 Pa.C.S. §1304) and rendering the contract unconscionable (UCC §2-302; 13 Pa.C.S. §2302; Restatement (Second) of Contracts §208). Biblically, this is the "wicked hand" afflicting the fatherless (Psalm 82:3-4; Exodus 22:22-23; Deuteronomy 24:17 impartial justice), a moral abomination echoing in constitutional treason (18 U.S.C. §2381; U.S. Const. art. VI, cl. 2; Pa. Const. Art. I, §1 inherent rights). The evidence below—contracts, mismatches, incentives—proves a RICO enterprise (18 U.S.C. §1961 et seq.; H.J. Inc. v. Northwestern Bell Tel. Co., 492 U.S. 229 (1989) pattern; Sedima v. Imrex Co., 473 U.S. 479 (1985) civil claims), with my case (CI-2021-03383, PACSES 8730073) as the smoking gun of irreparable harms: fraudulent PFA enabling child abduction, denied bifurcation prolonging entrapment, unequal custody despite fitness, and support extortion ignoring \$28M losses, driving me to poverty and foreclosure.

What follows is a step-by-step exposure, substantiated by federal/state law, regulations, case law, and the Lancaster agreement itself. Each step ties general cartel mechanics to my specific facts, leaving no outs for squirmers like Mahon—his actions are wrong on every layer, from Biblical equity to UCC defenses.

Step 1: Federal Funding and Incentives – The Cartel's Financial Engine

The cartel is powered by federal agencies (HHS/SSA) under Title IV-D (42 U.S.C. §651 et seq.; Public Law 93-647), granting states billions for enforcement (45 C.F.R. §304.20 funding) with performance incentives (45 C.F.R. §305.33; 42 U.S.C. §658a). Evidence shows 30-50% mismatches in collections vs. disbursements—laundering via falsified reports (18 U.S.C. §1001 false statements; 31 U.S.C. §3729 False Claims Act). The Lancaster agreement (§5.5 "Reimbursement by DHS of Expenditures"; §6.1 "Computation of Incentive Payment") ties counties to this, requiring "federally reimbursable" expenditures (§5.6 "Expenditures Must be Federally Reimbursable") but enabling fraud (§3.3 remittance without robust audit; §8.1 "Audits" rarely enforced, per §8.6 "Penalties for Noncompliance" unapplied). Biblically, this is usury on the vulnerable (Exodus 22:25; Proverbs 31:8-9 advocate for needy). Constitutionally, it breaches 14th Amendment equal protection (Village of Willowbrook v. Olech, 528 U.S. 562 (2000)) by targeting fathers without strict scrutiny (Meyer v. Nebraska, 262 U.S. 390 (1923) parental rights). Code violations: 18 U.S.C. §§1341/1343 fraud in transmissions. Regs ignored (45 C.F.R. §303.8 reviews). Case law flouted (Turner v. Rogers, 564 U.S. 431 (2011) ability-to-pay). Court rules: Fed. R. Civ. P. 60(b) voids fraudulent orders. UCC: Incentives as unconscionable bounties (UCC §2-302). State Const.: Pa. Const. Art. I, §26 no discrimination. Code: 18 Pa.C.S. §3921 theft via mismatches. Regs: 55 Pa. Code §187.21

cooperation without safeguards. Case law: Curtis v. Kline, 542 Pa. 249 (1995) equal protection. Court rules: Pa.R.C.P. 1910.16 rebuttable ignored.

In my case, this engine drove \$280k in collections, resulting in \$41K arrears inflation (§3.6 "Accounting and Fiscal Records" unproduced despite FOIA, violating 5 U.S.C. §552; 65 P.S. §67.101 RTKL), despite my large business losses—fraudulent collections (§3.3) without credit for in-kind support (42 U.S.C. §666(a)(9)(C); 45 C.F.R. §302.56(g)), pushing me to foreclosure and poverty.

Step 2: State Involvement and Governor's Signature – Collusion at the Commonwealth Level

Governors sign State Plans (42 U.S.C. §654; 45 C.F.R. §302.10), cascading to county agreements like Lancaster's, signed by Commissioners (attached p.1: Gary Kline, garykline@pacses.com; Federal I.D. 23-6003055; SAP Vendor 139096). This binds DHS to "supervise" (§4.1 "Responsibility to Supervise Title IV-D Program") but enables mismatches (§5.7 "Recovery of Federal Overpayments" ignored; §5.8 "Recovery of Commonwealth Expenditures" selective). Evidence: PA's plan (unproduced despite FOIA defaults) greenlights incentives (§6.2 "Payment of Incentives"; §6.3 "Use of Federal Reimbursement and Incentive Monies"), siphoning billions—30-50% delta per DRS (§3.3; web_search: PA Auditor General 2022 report on Title IV-D discrepancies, noting unaccounted funds). Biblically, governors "pervert judgment" (Deuteronomy 24:17; Psalm 82:3-4 defend fatherless). State Const.: Pa. Const. Art. I, §26 no discrimination (gender bias in obligor assignments). Code: 23 Pa.C.S. §4352 enforcement without due process. Regs: 55 Pa. Code §187.21 cooperation lacking safeguards. Case law: Curtis v. Kline equal protection. Court rules: Pa.R.C.P. 1910.16 rebuttable guidelines abused. UCC: Signatures create bad-faith contracts (UCC §1-203; 13 Pa.C.S. §1203). Fed. Code: 18 U.S.C. §1956 laundering via overpayments.

In my case, Shapiro's signature enabled Mahon's ultra vires orders (§1.2 twisted to evade §9 supremacy), unrebuked despite my reports to AG Sunday (resulting in armed intimidation—18 U.S.C. §1513 retaliation; 18 Pa.C.S. §4952 intimidation)—defaults admit complicity (§8.7 "Appeal of Determination of Noncompliance" unused).

Step 3: County and Judicial Execution – Revenue Commissioners in Action

Lancaster's agreement designates DRS as IV-D agency (§2.1 "Responsibility to Provide Title IV-D Services"), binding courts to services (§2.2 "Enumeration of Title IV-D Services") while affirming supremacy (§9). Evidence: §3.3 remittance hides siphoning (30-50% not disbursed, per §5.10 "Local Funding Requirement" mismatches; web_search: OCSE 2023 audit on PA IV-D, noting discrepancies). Judges omit supremacy, issuing voids (ultra vires; Bradley v. Fisher). Biblically, "defend the fatherless" ignored (Psalm 82:3-4). Fed. Const.: 14th Amendment due process (Mathews). Code: 18 U.S.C. §1581 peonage. Regs: 45 C.F.R. §303.101 expedited without process. Case law: DeShaney v. Winnebago Cnty., 489 U.S. 189 (1989) state-created dangers. Court rules: Fed. R. Civ. P. 60(b) voiding. State Const.: Pa. Const. Art. I, §1 liberty. Code: 23 Pa.C.S. §6107 PFA hearings abused. Regs: 55 Pa. Code §3140.21 due process. Case law: Com. v. Haigh, 874 A.2d 1174 (2005) no custody leverage. Court rules: Pa.R.C.P. 1901.5 procedures violated. UCC: Orders as drafts without defenses (13 Pa.C.S. §3305).

In my case, Lancaster DRS (§3.14 "Pennsylvania Child Support Enforcement System Operations") enforced Mahon's fraudulent support (\$2,806/month ignoring losses; arrears inflation violating §3.6 fiscal records), PFA (§2.6 "Use of Long Arm Procedures" misused for custody), and custody denials—§1.2 "independence" sham evading §9 (Blessing v. Freestone).

Step 4: Wives and Attorneys as Co-Conspirators – Private Actors in the Racket

Wives/attorneys initiate fraud (misrepresentations as perjury, 18 U.S.C. §1621; 18 Pa.C.S. §4902). Evidence: Lancaster agreement §3.13 legal services enable collusion (§3.12 Children and Youth integration for custody grabs). Biblically, false witness (Exodus 20:16). Fed. Const.: 1st Amendment petition (Boddie v. Connecticut, 401 U.S. 371 (1971)). Code: 18 U.S.C. §1962(d) aiding RICO. Case law: Christopher v. Harbury, 536 U.S. 403 (2002) deception. State Code: 23 Pa.C.S. §6107 hearings manipulated. Case law: Ettinger v. Ettinger, 637 P.2d 9 (1981) equal custody. UCC: Petitions as unconscionable (UCC §2-302).

In my case, wife Alene Reich and attorney Wendy Chan filed fraudulent PFA/contempt (§3.4 "Safeguarding Information" hides misrepresentations), aiding abduction—defaults acquiesce (§8.4 "Corrective Action Plans" unheeded).

Step 5: Enforcement by Law Enforcement – Predicate Acts and Self-Protection

Agreements (§3.13 IGAs) loop DAs/sheriffs, enforcing voids (evidence: §8.1 audits unenforced, allowing mismatches). Biblically, oppression of poor (Proverbs 31:8-9). Fed. Const.: 4th Amendment seizures (Tennessee v. Lane, 541 U.S. 509 (2004)). Code: 18 U.S.C. §1201 kidnapping. Regs: 45 C.F.R. §303.100 fair enforcement ignored. Case law: United States v. Guest, 383 U.S. 745 (1966) conspiracy. State Code: 18 Pa.C.S. §5105 hindering. Case law: In re D.A., 801 A.2d 614 (2002) due process. UCC: Seizures as conversion (UCC §3-420; 13 Pa.C.S. §3420).

In my case, AG Sunday's armed visit (§3.11 "Cooperation with DHS Staff" extends to enforcement collusion) retaliates for reports—predicate for RICO (§8.5 "Suspension of Payments" should halt but doesn't). I asked him where in his guidelines are personal armed visits to hand deliver legal threats and he never got back to me.

Step 6: Oversight Failure – Compromised Guardians and Cover-Ups

Boards/courts default (§8.2 "Program Performance and Operating Standards"; evidence: §8.6 penalties unapplied). Biblically, misprision as failing to "deliver the needy" (Psalm 82:4). Fed. Code: 18 U.S.C. §2382 misprision. Regs: 45 C.F.R. §303.35 audits. Case law: Armstrong v. Exceptional Child Ctr., Inc., 575 U.S. 320 (2015) supremacy. State Case law: Com. v. Bolden, 472 Pa. 602 (1977) mandates. UCC: Oversight as bad faith (UCC §1-203).

In my case, Judicial Conduct Board silence on Mahon (§10.3 "Termination" for noncompliance uninvoked) covers bias—defaults bind as estoppel (UCC §1-308).

This evidence—contracts, mismatches, harms—seals the cartel's fate: void (§9 breach; Fed. R. Civ. P. 60(b)), criminal (RICO), liable.

The Staggering Scale of the Cartel

Billions in Fraud, Mismatches, and Stolen Childhoods— Audits Expose the Crime Spree in Pennsylvania and Nationally

To the thieving overlords of this black-collar syndicate and their gutless enablers: The Black Collar Cartel's fraud isn't some petty scam—it's a monumental heist on a biblical scale, plundering billions while shattering families and mocking divine justice. Biblically, this is the abomination of robbing the fatherless (Exodus 22:22-23: "Ye shall not afflict any widow, or fatherless child... I will surely hear their cry"), perverting equity like the taskmasters of Pharaoh (Exodus 5:6-9), and ignoring the command to defend the needy from the wicked (Psalm 82:3-4; Proverbs 31:8-9). Legally, it's treason against the Supremacy Clause (U.S. Const. art. VI, cl. 2), racketeering through mismatched Title IV-D funds (18 U.S.C. § 1961 et seq.; *H.J. Inc. v. Northwestern Bell Tel. Co.*, 492 U.S. 229 (1989), pattern of fraud; *Sedima v. Imrex Co.*, 473 U.S. 479 (1985), civil remedies for victims), money laundering (18 U.S.C. §§ 1956-1957, criminally derived property), and mail/wire fraud in bogus reports (18 U.S.C. §§ 1341, 1343). Pennsylvania audits reveal systemic "irregularities" and noncompliance—code for theft—while national reports from the Office of Child Support Enforcement (OCSE) and GAO expose overcollections, undistributed funds, and mismatches amounting to billions stolen from fathers and defrauded from taxpayers. This isn't incompetence; it's organized crime, with incentives as bounties (§6.1 in Lancaster Cooperative Agreement) driving judges to issue void orders without due process (*Mathews v. Eldridge*, 424 U.S. 319 (1976); *Turner v. Rogers*, 564 U.S. 431 (2011)). The scale is staggering: In PA alone, hundreds of millions diverted annually; nationally, trillions in cumulative harm. Evidence below—audits, stats, reports—bolsters the case: This cartel commits daily felonies, demanding immediate dismantlement.

Pennsylvania: A Hotbed of Fraud, Mismatches, and Systemic Deficiencies

In Pennsylvania, the cartel's fraud runs rampant, with audits uncovering "material noncompliance" risks from fraud higher than error (Child Support Enforcement Program Audit NPRM; Bedford County 2023 Audit: "The risk of not detecting material noncompliance resulting from fraud is higher than for that resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions..."). The Auditor General's reports on Title IV-D (2020-2025) highlight irregularities in collections, overpayments, and undistributed funds—e.g., the 2022 Single Audit Report (Commonwealth of Pennsylvania Single Audit for FY Ended June 30, 2022) notes weaknesses in child support enforcement monitoring, with unaccounted disbursements violating 45 C.F.R. § 303.8 (periodic reviews). A 2024 guidelines review (Review of the Pennsylvania Child Support Guidelines) admits deviations are common but fails to address mismatches, where 30-50% of "collected" funds vanish—fraud per 18 Pa.C.S. § 3921 (theft by unlawful taking) and 18 U.S.C. § 1956. While matching funds to PA is on the order of hundreds of millions of dollars the amount collected from fathers is in the billion+ range, so 30-50% of those funds not being properly disbursed over many years makes the scale of this fraud in the tens or hundreds of billions of dollars.

County audits amplify this: Erie (2024 Audit), Adams (2024), Berks (2023), Blair (2023), and Tioga (2023) all flag fraud risks in noncompliance, with procedures unresponsive to errors (: "Identify and assess the risks of material noncompliance, whether due to fraud or error"). The 2023 Bedford Audit () explicitly warns of fraud's higher detection risk due to "intentional omissions" in child support accounting—echoing my case's \$50K arrears inflation. PA's child support application fraud is rampant (LegalMatch article: Deception in support determinations), with overcollections unchecked (EVIDENCE OF MISTAKEN IDENTITY REVERSES SUPPORT ORDER: Errors in identity lead to wrongful arrears). Auditor General

DeFoor's 2025 releases (Q4 2025 Children & Youth Audits; Franklin County 2022-2023; Q3 2025; Q2 2025) expose ongoing deficiencies in Title IV-D, with noncompliance penalties unapplied (§8.6 in agreement)—fraud enabling human trafficking (§2904 custody interference) and oppression (§5301 official oppression).

Stats bolster the crime: PA collected ~\$1.4B in child support FY2023 (OCSE data), but audits show mismatches/irregularities in 10-20% of cases (State reps propose audit amid fraud; Audit proposed for child care, analogous to IV-D). Extrapolate: \$280M-420M annually defrauded/laundered—treason (§2381) against Pa. Const. Art. I, §11 (open courts). No strict scrutiny (Curtis v. Kline, 542 Pa. 249 (1995)) justifies this; it's whim under Pa.R.C.P. 1910.16 and crime under a staggering amount of title 18.

National Extrapolation: A Multi-Billion Dollar Fraud Empire

Nationally, the cartel's scale is apocalyptic: OCSE reports FY2023 collections \$34B, but undistributed funds hit \$1B+ annually (GAO-04-377: \$657M undistributed in 2002, mismatches persisting; FY2018 AFR: Improper payments in child support). Audits reveal overcollections/fraud in 11%+ of payments (Federal audit errors 11%; \$236B federal improper payments FY2023, including IV-D). HHS froze grants in 5 states for fraud (2026 freeze amid Minnesota scandal: \$100M+ misused; Verify-First shock), with mismatches enabling laundering (ASPE report: 35% undistributed due to errors/fraud).

Stats: 14M cases nationwide, 70% collections via withholding (NCSEA Quick Facts), but 30% error rate in audits (OCSE Data Reliability FY2024). Extrapolate: \$10B+ annual fraud (Thomson Reuters: Success rate 65%, implying \$12B mismatched). Reports confirm: OCSE Annual Report to Congress (FY2018: Weaknesses in mismatches); DCCB report on fraud recovery. This is RICO (18-7897 petition: Fraudulent orders as predicates), with incentives as bounties (§6.1). Biblical scale: Robbing fatherless on industrial level (Isaiah 10:1-2 woe to unjust decrees). Fed. code: §1956 laundering; regs: 45 C.F.R. §303.35 audits ignored. Case law: Armstrong v. Exceptional Child Ctr., Inc., 575 U.S. 320 (2015) supremacy violations. UCC: Mismatches as conversion (§3-420).

This fraud destroys lives: Millions denied custody (national 70% mothers primary; SSA reports mismatches in NDNH), billions stolen—crime demanding dismantlement (18 U.S.C. §1964). In my case, \$41K arrears reflect this national plague.

Local DRS Failure

Evidence of Theft and Non-Disbursement – A Microcosm of Cartel Fraud

To the pilfering functionaries of the Lancaster Domestic Relations Section and their overseers in the Black Collar Cartel: Your brazen refusal to disclose basic accounting records in my case (PACSES 8730073) is not mere administrative sloth but prima facie evidence of outright theft, fraud, and money laundering—seizing funds from fathers like me while withholding disbursement to recipients, all to siphon unaccounted profits and inflate federal claims. Biblically, this is the grievous sin of oppressing the fatherless through deceitful decrees (Isaiah 10:1-2: "Woe unto them that decree unrighteous decrees, and that write grievousness which they have prescribed; to turn aside the needy from judgment"), robbing the vulnerable like the unjust stewards condemned in Luke 16:1-13. Legally, your three-month silence since my October 21, 2025, request for seized vs. distributed amounts constitutes willful obstruction (18 U.S.C. § 1505), conspiracy to defraud (18 U.S.C. § 371), and misprision of felony (18 U.S.C. § 4), while breaching the Cooperative Agreement's mandate for prompt access to case records (§3.5 "Case Record Standards," requiring maintenance and availability within 5 days per DHS protocols). This isn't incompetence; it's cartel criminality, where DRS pockets the delta between \$240K extorted from me and whatever pittance reached my ex-wife, laundering the rest through falsified reports to HHS (§3.3 "Remittance of Collections," unaccounted mismatches violating 45 C.F.R. § 303.100 fair enforcement). The scale of this fraud in my case alone—potentially \$40K stolen—mirrors Pennsylvania's audit-flagged irregularities and national billion-dollar mismatches, demanding immediate disclosure, cessation of operations, and criminal referrals.

The email thread titled "Seized vs Distributed 967300735" (initiated October 21, 2025, to DROsupportinfo@DROsupportinfo@PACSES.COM) lays bare your dereliction. I requested the latest total of all monies seized/garnished from me (Blair J. Reich) and how much was disbursed to Alene Wilmoth Reich, noting I had been billed ~\$280K and extorted ~\$240K. This is routine information your system must maintain (§3.14 "Pennsylvania Child Support Enforcement System Operations," requiring real-time accounting). Your Cooperative Agreement with DHS obligates prompt response—within 5 days for such queries (§3.5 standards; §3.11 "Cooperation with DHS Staff Required," extending to litigant access). Yet, after 10 days, I followed up on November 1, 2025, to LancoTeam5, escalating to a formal FOIA/RTKL request due to the delay, citing your contractual duty and warning of obstruction charges.

In that escalation, I demanded an unredacted copy of Lancaster's Cooperative Agreement (now attached as evidence of your noncompliance) and the State Plan, plus all contracts touching Title IV-D reimbursements, matching funds, or incentives (§5.1 "Annual Budget Plan"; §6.1 "Computation of Incentive Payment"). I invoked legal basis: U.S. Const. Art. VI (Supremacy); Amend. I (petition); Amend. XIV (due process/equal protection); 5 U.S.C. § 552 (FOIA); 42 U.S.C. § 654(3) (public plans); 45 C.F.R. § 302.10(a) (cooperative agreements public); Dep't of Justice v. Tax Analysts, 492 U.S. 136 (1989) (absolute access); Pa. Const. Art. I, § 11 (redress); 65 P.S. § 67.101 (RTKL). I attached a 51-page criminal complaint alleging DRS racketeering/trafficking via treason, putting you on notice of conspiracy risks (§8.4 "Corrective Action Plans" ignored). I issued a "Notice and Demand" for constitutional compliance, "Cease and Desist" from violations, and "Stark Choice" to operate lawfully or join the cartel.

Three months later—no response. This default is criminal: Obstruction (§1505), fraud (§1341 for withheld reports), and misprision (§2382, failing to report known treason). Your silence admits the mismatch—extorted \$240K not fully disbursed, siphoning the delta as theft (§3921; UCC §3-420 conversion; 13 Pa.C.S. §3420). Nationally, OCSE reports \$1B undistributed annually (GAO-04-377), with PA's share ~\$100M (Auditor General 2022 Single Audit weaknesses). This is laundering (§1956), with incentives as bounties (§6.1) driving it. Audits confirm: Bedford 2023 flags fraud via omissions; Erie/Adams/Berks 2023-2024 note noncompliance risks higher for fraud (collusion/forgery).

Silence is Deafening

A Universal Default That Screams Complicity in Black Collar Cartel Crimes

Your near-total silence in response to Phase I's "Convuluted Federal Supremacy" is not mere oversight or administrative delay—it is a deafening admission of guilt, a sweeping default that thrusts you all into criminal complicity with the Black Collar Cartel's treasonous operations. VI, § 3 judicial oaths; 28 U.S.C. § 1746 declarations), contractual duties (§3.9 bonding in cooperative agreements), and transparency laws (5 U.S.C. § 552 FOIA; 65 P.S. § 67.101 RTKL). The silence screams: You are all guilty, and this affidavit seals your fate—demanding immediate investigations, impeachments, and prosecutions under 18 U.S.C. §§ 241-242 (rights deprivation) and § 1964 (RICO civil remedies).

The federal blackout from SSA and HHS is particularly damning: A complete failure to respond to my December 24, 2025, demands for State Plans, cooperative agreements, financials, contracts, oaths, bonds, and incentives—no acknowledgment, no documents, no Vaughn index for withholdings (U.S. Dep't of State v. Ray, 502 U.S. 164 (1991)). This stonewalling obstructs my investigation into their funding of the cartel (45 C.F.R. § 302.10(a) mandating public plans), constituting misprision of felony (18 U.S.C. § 4) and aiding treason (§2381), as they continue pumping billions despite known mismatches (45 C.F.R. § 303.35 audits ignored). Their silence admits to enabling the 30-50% siphoning I allege, defrauding taxpayers under the False Claims Act (31 U.S.C. § 3729).

PA DHS's response was incomplete and noncompliant: Andrea Bankes's January 5, 2026, "interim" email (ra-dpwrkl@pa.gov) provided no substantive records—no State Plan, no cooperative agreements, no incentives schedules (§6.1 in Lancaster agreement), no list of exclusions or segregable portions—merely extending time under 65 P.S. § 67.902(a)(7) without justification. This evasion breaches RTKL's absolute access (65 P.S. § 67.101; Pa. Const. Art. I, § 11 redress), conspiring to hide fraud (§3.3 remittance mismatches). Their partial dribble signals concealment, warranting penalties (§8.6 in agreement) and criminal referrals (18 Pa.C.S. § 5101 obstructing law). The remaining 249 failures—every judge like Mahon, officials like Shapiro/Sunday, and agencies—ignored demands for personal contracts/oaths/bonds (§3.9), thrusting them into the cartel. This universal default is admission: No rebuttal to treason allegations means acquiescence (principles of estoppel; UCC § 1-308), binding all to RICO liability (H.J. Inc. v. Northwestern Bell Tel. Co., 492 U.S. 229 (1989) pattern). In my case, this silence amid armed AG intimidation and DRS stonewalling on seized/distributed funds screams cover-up—demanding DOJ probes and impeachments (§455 bias; Pa. Code Jud. Conduct Rule 2.11).

Anticipating Mahon's Abuse of Process

A Predetermined Show Trial Designed to Perpetuate Cartel Harms, Evade Accountability, and Retaliate

To the disgraced Retired Senior Racketeer William P. Mahon and his cartel cronies: Your transparent scheme to further abuse judicial process in my case is not a clever maneuver but a predictable, premeditated assault on justice, engineered to railroad me through a sham hearing while shielding your treasonous conduct from scrutiny. Biblically, this is the epitome of perverting judgment like the wicked who "decree unrighteous decrees" and "turn aside the needy from judgment" (Isaiah 10:1-2), stopping your ears to the cry of the oppressed (Proverbs 21:13) and failing to "judge righteously" as commanded (Proverbs 31:8-9). Legally, your actions—bad faith reliance on contract clauses to subvert federal supremacy, dismissing my motion to dismiss wife's contempt petition without any hearing, scheduling a combined support review and contempt proceeding on March 12, 2026, refusing to address constitutional challenges to the legality of support orders, rejecting irrefutable evidence of my reduced income and capacity, and persisting in adjudication despite irreconcilable bias—constitute gross due process violations, transforming the proceedings into a predetermined show trial that reeks of bad faith and retaliation. This is not neutral adjudication but a calculated continuation of the Black Collar Cartel's racketeering, depriving me of fundamental fairness, due notice, substantive and procedural due process, equal protection, and an impartial tribunal, while perpetuating state-created dangers and blaming me for the fallout—all in violation of every layer of law, from divine mandates to contractual obligations.

This isn't your first rodeo in rigging show trials; the docket in my custody matter (Lancaster County CI-21-02607) reveals a pattern of blatant process abuse, where you set up harms, ignore motions, and orchestrate biased outcomes to favor revenue over rights. The December 20, 2023, final custody order by Judge Hackman forced my three children from private to public school starting September 2024, ignoring continuity of education under 23 Pa.C.S. § 5328(4)—a state-created danger that manifested predictably in harm. I filed motions to stop the transfer (e.g., pre-September 2024), but you dismissed or ignored them without hearings, violating procedural due process (*Cleveland Bd. of Educ. v. Loudermill*, 470 U.S. 532 (1985); Pa.R.C.P. 1915.4 requiring prompt resolution). By November 2024, all three children suffered: the oldest experienced urgent panic attacks in school, the middle demanded online switch amid suicidal thoughts/attempts (documented in my November 4, 2024, emergency motion), and the youngest hated school daily—direct results of your order, yet you blamed me.

I filed modifications citing these harms (e.g., November 4, 2024, "Emergency Motion to Reconsider"), but my wife retaliated with a November 22, 2024, petition for full custody. You ordered "counseling" on December 13, 2024—not evaluation as requested (§3.12 CY requirements in cooperative agreement abused for delay)—months of sessions (continued multiple times: January 2, 2025; January 16, 2025; March 10, 2025), violating expedited process (45 C.F.R. § 303.101; Pa.R.C.P. 1915.10 timely decisions). The June 2025 therapist report (from Yolanda Larson/Amy Roth) favored mother after rough sessions—biased, as you set the stage for negative outcomes. I warned kids of likely loss (June 2025), advising they take belongings—a protected discussion (1st Amendment; *West Virginia State Bd. of Educ. v. Barnette*, 319 U.S. 624 (1943)). At the August 22, 2025, "conference," you sua sponte converted it to a hearing without notice (Pa.R.C.P. 1915.4 no surprise changes; due process breach per *Goldberg v. Kelly*, 397 U.S. 254 (1970)), changed custody without initial opinion (violating Pa.R.C.P. 1915.10 reasoning requirement), chastised me for discussions (chilling speech, *Hartman v. Moore*, 547 U.S. 250 (2006)), and deprived parental rights (*Troxel v. Granville*, 530 U.S. 57 (2000)). Your October 9, 2025, opinion conceded

fitness but used "best interest" whim (23 Pa.C.S. § 5328) without strict scrutiny—admitting no compelling interest justified abridgment (*Wisconsin v. Yoder*, 406 U.S. 205 (1972)).

This pattern—engineering dangers (school switch), ignoring motions (e.g., my August 14, 2025, jurisdictional challenges; September 9, 2025, exhibits rejected), rigging "hearings" (*sua sponte* changes), and blaming victims (chastising discussions)—repeats in support/contempt. You know my large losses/firing/crypto crash (evidenced in tax returns, Pa.R.E. 803(6) admissible) yet enforce absurd amounts based on false income—planning March 12 contempt to jail me for unpayable arrears, a peonage trap (13th Amendment; *Bailey v. Affidavit of Probable Cause

4. Mahon refuses to address constitutional questions on support legality (e.g., Federal Supremacy application under U.S. Const. art. VI, cl. 2), evading strict scrutiny for abridging fundamental rights.

10. At August 22, 2025, "conference," Mahon sua sponte converted to hearing without notice (Pa.R.C.P. 1915.4 violation), changed custody without initial opinion (Pa.R.C.P. 1915.10 requirement), chastised discussions (1st Amendment chill), deprived rights (Troxel v. Granville, 530 U.S. 57 (2000)).
11. October 9, 2025, opinion conceded fitness but used "best interest" whim without strict scrutiny—admitting no compelling interest (Wisconsin v. Yoder, 406 U.S. 205 (1972)).
12. These bad faith actions constitute new crimes under Federal Title 18: § 241 conspiracy against rights (depriving due process/equal protection); § 242 deprivation under color of law (bias/retaliation); § 371 conspiracy to defraud (rigging hearings for predetermined outcomes); § 1505 obstruction of proceedings (dismissing without hearings); § 1512 tampering (sua sponte

changes); § 1513 retaliation (punishing exposures); § 2381 treason (subverting Constitution via sham trials); § 2384 sedition (conspiring against lawful process).

Legally, these questions arise from the Lancaster County Court of Common Pleas' and Domestic Relations Section's entrenched pattern of misconduct, where deliberate omissions of procedural safeguards, biased enforcement driven by Title IV-D incentives (42 U.S.C. § 651 et seq.), and willful defiance of federal mandates have systematically stripped litigants like me of fundamental rights, perpetuating a regime of injustice that demands rigorous appellate scrutiny, federal intervention, and dismantlement of these abuses to enforce the supremacy of the Constitution over corrupt state practices. The following questions build upon Phase I's foundation, adding new dimensions based on recent docket abuses (e.g., sua sponte hearing conversions, evidence rejection, and retaliatory contempt scheduling), ensuring no aspect of your cartel escapes constitutional condemnation.

Constitutional Questions Presented (Incorporating and Expanding Phase I)

1. Whether the Lancaster County Court of Common Pleas and associated Domestic Relations Section's systematic deprivation of pre-deprivation hearings, neutral arbitration, and meaningful notice in child support and custody proceedings violates the Due Process Clause of the Fourteenth Amendment, as established in *Mathews v. Eldridge*, 424 U.S. 319 (1976), and *Cleveland Board of Education v. Loudermill*, 470 U.S. 532 (1985), where such omissions facilitate the extraction of property and parental liberties without fundamental fairness or procedural safeguards.
2. Whether the imposition of asymmetric custody and support orders, disproportionately burdening fathers to maximize federal reimbursements under Title IV-D of the Social Security Act (42 U.S.C. § 651 et seq.), constitutes invidious gender-based discrimination in violation of the Equal Protection Clause of the Fourteenth Amendment, as articulated in *Doe v. Purdue University*, 928 F.3d 652 (7th Cir. 2019), and *Village of Willowbrook v. Olech*, 528 U.S. 562 (2000), resulting in unequal treatment of similarly situated litigants without a compelling state interest.
3. Whether state courts' deliberate circumvention of Supreme Court precedents on parental rights—such as *Troxel v. Granville*, 530 U.S. 57 (2000), and *Santosky v. Kramer*, 455 U.S. 745 (1982)—by issuing orders that sever parental bonds without strict scrutiny or evidence of unfitness, infringes upon the substantive due process protections of the Fourteenth Amendment and the fundamental liberty interest in the care, custody, and control of one's children.
4. Whether the enforcement of child support obligations through ex parte seizures of income, assets, and tax refunds, without regard to ability to pay or retroactive modification, effects an unconstitutional taking of property under the Fifth and Fourteenth Amendments, as prohibited by *Boddie v. Connecticut*, 401 U.S. 371 (1971), and constitutes involuntary servitude in violation of

the Thirteenth Amendment, where such actions coerce labor under threat of incarceration, per *Turner v. Rogers*, 564 U.S. 431 (2011).

5. Whether the state judiciary's refusal to adhere to federally mandated procedural requirements under Title IV-D regulations (45 C.F.R. §§ 302-308), including affirmation of federal supremacy in cooperative agreements, contravenes the Supremacy Clause of Article VI of the United States Constitution, as reaffirmed in *Cooper v. Aaron*, 358 U.S. 1 (1958), thereby rendering void ab initio all orders issued in defiance of federal law and precedents.
6. Whether the pattern of judicial indifference to notified constitutional deprivations—evidenced by denials of recusal motions, strikes of filings, and continuances favoring one party—amounts to a conspiracy to deprive rights under color of law, violating the First Amendment's Petition Clause and the Fourteenth Amendment's guarantees of access to courts and equal protection, as protected by *Bounds v. Smith*, 430 U.S. 817 (1977), and *Haines v. Kerner*, 404 U.S. 519 (1972).
7. Whether the retaliatory denial of pro se filings, imposition of sanctions, and suppression of grievances in response to constitutional challenges constitutes retaliation in violation of the First Amendment, as established in *Hartman v. Moore*, 547 U.S. 250 (2006), thereby chilling protected speech and the right to petition for redress of grievances.
8. Whether the imposition of economically destructive child support levies, punitive incarcerations, and excessive fines without proportionality or regard for indigency violates the Eighth Amendment's prohibitions on excessive fines and cruel and unusual punishment, as interpreted in *Timbs v. Indiana*, 586 U.S. 146 (2019), and *United States v. Bajakajian*, 524 U.S. 321 (1998), where such measures serve primarily to generate Title IV-D revenue rather than support children.
9. Whether the Lancaster County judiciary's systemic disregard for Pennsylvania state court rules (e.g., Pa.R.C.P. 1901.5, 1915.4, and 1920.51 requiring prompt hearings, notices, and fair processes in family matters), state regulations, and case law—coupled with obstruction of access to public records under the Pennsylvania Right-to-Know Law (65 P.S. § 67.101 et seq.)—violates Article I, §§ 1, 11, and 26 of the Pennsylvania Constitution, denying inherent rights, open courts, remedies by due course of law without delay or denial, and equal protection without discrimination, thereby compounding federal constitutional harms through state-level procedural abuses.
10. Whether a judge's continued adjudication of a case, despite being directly accused of treason, racketeering, and constitutional violations in prior affidavits (as with Mahon's role in Phase I), creates an irreconcilable conflict of interest and bias, violating the Fourteenth Amendment's guarantee of an impartial tribunal and fundamental fairness, as required by *Tumey v. Ohio*, 273 U.S. 510 (1927), and *Caperton v. A.T. Massey Coal Co.*, 556 U.S. 868 (2009).
11. Whether the sua sponte conversion of a custody conference into a full hearing without notice or opportunity to prepare, as occurred in June 2025, constitutes a deprivation of procedural due process under the Fourteenth Amendment and Pennsylvania Rules of Civil Procedure (Pa.R.C.P. 1915.4), where such ambush tactics prejudice the litigant and enable predetermined outcomes without rebuttal.
12. Whether the judicial chastisement of a parent for discussing potential court outcomes with children, as in the June Temporary Custody Order or the October 9, 2025 opinion and order, infringes upon First Amendment free speech rights and the fundamental parental liberty to direct upbringing under *Troxel v. Granville*, 530 U.S. 57 (2000), constituting retaliation for protected expression and chilling familial communication.
13. Whether the refusal to reconsider or vacate orders that demonstrably cause harm to children—such as the school transfer leading to panic attacks, suicidal ideation, and distress (evidenced in November 4, 2024, emergency motion)—violates substantive due process under the Fourteenth Amendment by creating state-created dangers (*DeShaney v. Winnebago County*,

489 U.S. 189 (1989)) and blaming the parent for foreseeable results, without applying strict scrutiny to abridge parental rights.

14. Whether the pattern of denying motions for recusal, striking filings, and imposing counseling as a delay tactic (e.g., continuances on January 2, 16, and March 10, 2025) amounts to official oppression and obstruction of justice under 18 Pa.C.S. §§ 5301 and 5101, while violating Article I, § 11 of the Pennsylvania Constitution by denying open courts and remedies without delay.
15. Whether the scheduling of a combined support review and contempt hearing on March 12, 2026, without addressing underlying constitutional defects in the support order, constitutes retaliatory conduct in violation of the First Amendment (*Hartman v. Moore*, 547 U.S. 250 (2006)) and prejudices the proceeding by merging unrelated issues, denying equal protection and fair process under the Fourteenth Amendment.

These expanded questions, building on Phase I's foundational challenges, demand immediate appellate and federal review to halt the cartel's assault on constitutional order. Your silence on these issues in prior defaults only amplifies the need for accountability—no further evasion will stand.

This Phase II affidavit, faxed directly to Pennsylvania Attorney General David Sunday for immediate investigation and intervention, exposes your brazen, systemic defiance of federal supremacy, procedural mandates, and constitutional safeguards, as detailed in the expanded questions above—violations that scream for accountability and dismantle your black-collar cartel before it devours more families. I demand the Pennsylvania Supreme Court invoke its extraordinary jurisdiction under 42 Pa.C.S. § 726 to seize plenary control of these custody, divorce, and support proceedings, halting all further abuses, vacating your tainted orders, and imposing swift sanctions on judges like Retired Senior Racketeer William P. Mahon for their retaliatory, bad-faith machinations that mock justice and pervert the rule of law.

Constitutional and Contractual Obligation of Federal Supremacy

An Unyielding Mandate Binding the Cartel

To the oath-breaking despots of the Black Collar Cartel and their enablers across Pennsylvania's compromised branches: You are irrevocably bound by unyielding obligations under federal and state law to affirm and uphold Federal Supremacy in every aspect of your operations, yet you persist in your treasonous defiance, as evidenced by Retired Senior Judge William P. Mahon's continued bad-faith adjudication in my matters (CI-2021-03383 support; CI-21-02607 custody). Biblically, this is a grievous sin against divine justice, perverting the command to "judge righteously" and defend the needy from the wicked (Proverbs 31:8-9; Psalm 82:3-4), while oppressing the fatherless through your racketeering scheme (Exodus 22:22-23). Evasion violates your judicial oaths (28 U.S.C. § 1746; PA Const. Art. VI, § 3) and Code of Judicial Conduct Rule 2.15 (requiring response to misconduct allegations). Furthermore, by participating in Title IV-D cooperative agreements (which involve administrative and contractual duties, e.g., enforcement under §2.2(i) and funding under §5-6), judges operate in a quasi-administrative capacity, waiving absolute judicial immunity for such acts (per *Forrester v. PA DHS issued a partial, evasive "interim" extension via Andrea Bankes on January 5, 2026, lacking substantive documents, a Vaughn index (*U.S. Dep't of State v. Ray*, 502 U.S. 164 (1991)), and key items like State Plans and incentives—breaching 65 P.S. § 67.101 et seq. (RTKL). Of the 251 respondents, 249 failed utterly, refusing employment agreements, bonds, insurance, or third-party contracts tied to Title IV-D funds, amounting to dereliction under 18 U.S.C. § 4 (misprision) and acquiescence by silence under UCC § 1-308 (estoppel). Lancaster DRS ignored my October 21/November 1, 2025, demands for seized vs. distributed funds in PACSES 8730073 (\$240K extorted from Blair J. Federal entities (HHS/SSA) are bound by FOIA; Pennsylvania entities (PA DHS) by RTKL; other states by their respective public records laws (detailed below). Individuals are bound by oaths, bonds, and contractual duties (§3.9 in cooperative

agreements), with escalation to DOJ referrals and RICO suits (18 U.S.C. § 1964) for non-compliance. Non-response by judges triggers immediate appeals to OOR (RTKL § 1101), mandamus petitions to compel disclosure (42 Pa.C.S. § 8301), and complaints to the Judicial Conduct Board for violating Code Rule 2.15 (failure to address misconduct). This includes personal liability under 42 U.S.C. § 1983 for due process violations.

We will demand your arrests, prosecutions, and disbarments through citizen-led grand juries, federal investigations, and public accountability campaigns. Your careers, reputations, and freedoms hang in the balance—comply fully, or face the unyielding consequences of your betrayal of justice.

Electronic format preferred (email/thumb drive), with searchable PDFs and native files. If no records, state in writing under penalty of perjury (28 U.S.C. § 1746; judges via judicial oath). Judges must personally certify or delegate to their Open Records Officer, with copies to judicial conduct boards.

NOTICE OF REQUIREMENT FOR REBUTTAL AFFIDAVIT AND INTENT TO FILE UCC-1

You are hereby required to provide a point-by-point rebuttal, via sworn affidavit under penalty of perjury pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 1746, addressing each and every fact asserted in the attached Affidavit of Fact. The public records acknowledgement must be signed by an authorized representative with firsthand knowledge and delivered to me no later than midnight on February 16, 2026. Full answers are due by February 26, 2026. Failure to timely rebut each point will be deemed your full acquiescence and consent to the validity of all claims, facts, and liabilities outlined therein, estopping you from any future denial or defense.

Furthermore, your silence represents your waiver of claims regarding sovereign immunity, high office immunity, judicial immunity, official immunity, quasi immunity, or any other form of personal immunity. Additionally, you waive any and all defenses such as statute of limitations, revocations, warranties, repudiation, modification, and/or novation. You waive your right to discharge by bankruptcy and agree that these debts and obligations will follow you to the Grave until repaid.

After this period to cure I will proceed to file a UCC-1 financing statement securing \$150 Trillion in damages against you as debtors, perfecting my security interest in all related claims, rights, and proceeds as previously detailed.

YOU HAVE ALREADY DEFAULTED

As a matter of law, once you were served proper notices, failed to rebut them point-for-point, and continued your unconstitutional levies, wage garnishments, and administrative coercion, you entered constructive default. Under Uniform Commercial Code §9-601(a) and §9-609(a)(1), a secured party (me) has the legal right to take possession of the collateral, which in this case includes monetary damages owed, liquidated claims, and any property unlawfully withheld or converted. These rights are self-executing, meaning I do not need judicial permission to enforce them. You forfeited that barrier.

Further, under UCC §9-625, I am entitled to collect the full value of the obligation, plus interest, incidental damages, consequential damages, and statutory penalties. That authority is federally preemptive, and codified again in 42 U.S.C. §1983, which grants me a private right of action for any deprivation of constitutional or federal statutory rights under color of state law.

Additionally, your failure to provide lawful orders, FOIA records, bond disclosures, and full accounting of mandatory reporting for Child Support despite repeated lawful demands constitutes further violations of:

- 5 U.S.C. §552 (FOIA)
- 45 C.F.R. §302–308 (Title IV-D transparency and audit obligations)
- 31 U.S.C. §3729 (False Claims Act) if match-funding fraud is involved
- Pennsylvania UCC and Commercial Enforcement statutes

To strengthen this, consider that in Pennsylvania, the UCC is codified at 13 Pa.C.S.A. §§ 1101 et seq., where default is triggered by non-performance or failure to cure breaches (13 Pa.C.S.A. § 9601(c) – rights cumulative). Your inaction—such as ignoring affidavits demanding rebuttal—creates "acquiescence by silence," a common law principle incorporated into UCC via § 1-308 (performance with reservation of rights), meaning unrebutted claims stand as admitted facts. By continuing levies (e.g., wage garnishments under color of void orders), you breached good faith duties (§ 1-304), allowing self-help remedies like possession without judicial process (§ 9-609(b)).

Your obstructions, like refusing FOIA or bond info, violate regulatory transparency (§ 1-202 notice requirements), compounding default under § 9-625(b) (remedies for noncompliance, including court costs). Inactions (e.g., no response to notices) equate to waiver (§ 2-208 course of performance), solidifying my secured interest in damages as collateral. This default is "constructive" per case law like **Com. v. DeBlase, 542 Pa. 22 (1995)** (inaction as admission in civil contexts), and federally protected under supremacy (Article VI), overriding state barriers.

YOU PROVIDE(D) THREE FORMS OF CONSENT

You have provided me or will soon provide me with three forms of consent for this process:

1. When you performed the initial rights violations or failed to protect me from harm.
2. When you were notified in multiple forms of the violations and failed to protect me from harm or escalated and retaliated due to the notification.
3. When you inevitably obstruct, conspire, and immediate default regarding this letter.

Pre-Federal Complaint Pre-emptive Notice

42 U.S.C. § 1983: Deprivation of Rights Under Color of Law – The Cartel's MO

To the defendants, their counsel, and any federal or state actors who may attempt to shield this cartel: Your actions under color of law—executing void orders, enforcing fraudulent Title IV-D collections, and retaliating against constitutional challenges—directly violate 42 U.S.C. § 1983. This statute provides a private right of action for any person deprived of "rights, privileges, or immunities secured by the Constitution and laws" by state actors (*Maine v. Thiboutot*, 448 U.S. 1 (1980)). Biblically, this is the "wicked" afflicting the fatherless (*Exodus 22:22-23*), perverting justice for gain (*Proverbs 31:8-9*). Legally, every judge, DRS official, sheriff, DA, AG, and governor's agent in this enterprise acted under color of state law (*West v. Atkins*, 487 U.S. 42 (1988)), even private actors performing public functions; *Adickes v. S.H. Kress & Co.*, 398 U.S. 144 (1970), joint action; *Brentwood Acad. v. Tenn. Secondary Sch. Athletic Ass'n*, 531 U.S. 288 (2001), entwinement). Your "custom" of ignoring Federal Supremacy (§9 of every Cooperative Agreement) is a deliberate policy depriving me (and thousands of fathers) of due process (14th Amendment), equal protection, parental rights (*Troxel v. Granville*, 530 U.S. 57 (2000)), and property without just compensation (5th Amendment takings via non-confiscatory violations, *Murphy v. Murphy*).

Specific deprivations in my case: Mahon's dismissal of motions without hearings (Loudermill due process violation), scheduling retaliatory contempt (*Hartman v. Moore* retaliation), rejecting evidence of losses (denial of fair process), and enforcing orders without Mathews balancing (424 U.S. 319 (1976)) or strict scrutiny for fundamental rights abridgment (*Yoder*). These are not mere errors—they are ultra vires acts outside judicial immunity (*Pulliam v. Allen*, 466 U.S. 522 (1984); *Forrester v. White*, 484 U.S. 219 (1988)). No "policy" of "judicial independence" (§1.2 sham) excuses treason (§2381). Damages: \$15T+ (custody loss, financial ruin, trauma), plus punitive for willful misconduct (*Smith v. Wade*, 461 U.S. 30 (1983)). This §1983 claim survives any defense—your defaults admit liability (distinguished from *Heck v. Humphrey*, 512 U.S. 477 (1994)—no favorable termination required for prospective relief or declaratory judgment).

Exhaustion of State Remedies and Abstention Analysis: Why Younger, Rooker-Feldman, and State Exhaustion Do Not Bar This Federal Action

To any court or defendant invoking abstention or exhaustion: Your likely defenses fail. *Younger v. Harris* (401 U.S. 37 (1971)) abstention does not apply where state proceedings are brought in bad faith to harass or retaliate (*Mitchum v. Foster*, 407 U.S. 225 (1972); *Huffman v. Pursue, Ltd.*, 420 U.S. 592 (1975) exceptions for constitutional challenges; *Dombrowski v. Pfister*, 380 U.S. 479 (1965)). Here, Mahon's contempt scheduling post-affidavit is pure retaliation (§1513; *Hartman*). *Rooker-Feldman* (*Rooker v. Fidelity Trust Co.*, 263 U.S. 413 (1923); *District of Columbia Court of Appeals v. Feldman*, 460 U.S. 462 (1983)) bars only "losing" parties seeking federal review of final state judgments—not ongoing

deprivations or parallel federal claims (*Skinner v. Switzer*, 562 U.S. 521 (2011)). My §752 appeal and habeas are not "final" (ongoing harms), and this is a separate §1983/RICO suit for damages (*Exxon Mobil Corp. v. Saudi Basic Indus. Corp.*, 544 U.S. 280 (2005)).

State exhaustion (e.g., 42 Pa.C.S. §6501 habeas) is futile—state courts are the cartel (Mahon presiding). Federal question jurisdiction (28 U.S.C. §1331) trumps; Supremacy Clause claims require no exhaustion (*Armstrong v. Exceptional Child Ctr.*, 575 U.S. 320 (2015); *Patsy v. Bd. of Regents*, 457 U.S. 496 (1982)). No Younger bar for federal supremacy violations (*Ohio Civil Rights Comm'n v. Dayton Christian Schools*, 477 U.S. 619 (1986) exceptions). This action proceeds—your abstention arguments are frivolous delay tactics (no Pullman abstention for "novel" state issues; no Colorado River parallelism; federal interest paramount).

Specific Immunity Waivers/Piercing Arguments: No Shield for Treasonous Ultra Vires Acts

To any defendant claiming immunity: Absolute/qualified immunity does not apply. Judicial immunity (*Stump v. Sparkman*, 435 U.S. 349 (1978)) is pierced for non-judicial acts or lack of jurisdiction (*Pierson v. Ray*, 386 U.S. 547 (1967); but see *Mireles v. Waco*, 502 U.S. 9 (1991) "function" test fails for malice). Mahon's acts—dismissing without hearing, ignoring supremacy (§9 contract), scheduling retaliation—are administrative/ ultra vires, not "judicial" (*Forrester v. White*). No immunity for §1983/RICO (42 U.S.C. §1983; 18 U.S.C. §1964). Prosecutorial immunity (*Imbler v. Pachtman*, 424 U.S. 409 (1976)) pierced for investigative/advocacy beyond scope (*Burns v. Reed*, 500 U.S. 478 (1991); *Buckley v. Fitzsimmons*, 509 U.S. 259 (1993)). Sovereign immunity waived by §1983 (*Quern v. Jordan*, 440 U.S. 332 (1979) but *Ex parte Young* for injunctive). Contracts (§3.9 bonds) expose personal liability. Defaults waive defenses. Immunity pierced—personal assets liable (no municipal immunity under *Owen v. City of Independence*, 445 U.S. 622 (1980); RICO overrides via conspiracy, *Dennis v. Sparks*, 449 U.S. 24 (1980)).

RICO Claims: The Cartel as a Patterned Enterprise of Ongoing Criminal Acts

The Black Collar Cartel is a RICO enterprise (18 U.S.C. §1962(c)): Association-in-fact (judges, DRS, sheriffs, DAs, AGs, governors via State Plans) with common purpose (Title IV-D revenue laundering; distinct from defendants per *Cedric Kushner Promotions, Ltd. v. King*, 533 U.S. 158 (2001)). Pattern of racketeering: Predicate acts (below) over 5+ years, continuous threat (*H.J. Inc.*). Interstate commerce affected (federal funds, mail/wire). My injury: Direct (custody loss, \$41K arrears, trauma) from predicates (18 U.S.C. §1964(c)). Treble damages + attorneys' fees. No immunity (*Scheidler v. Nat'l Org. for Women*, 537 U.S. 393 (2003)). Defaults admit enterprise (defendants conduct/participate in operation/management per *Reves v. Ernst & Young*, 507 U.S. 170 (1993)).

Predicate Acts: Specific Criminal Building Blocks of the RICO Enterprise

The cartel's pattern comprises these predicates (18 U.S.C. §1961(1)):

- Mail/Wire Fraud (18 U.S.C. §§1341/1343): Bogus orders/notices transmitted to collect/extort (e.g., my arrears notices).
- Extortion (18 U.S.C. §1951 Hobbs; 18 Pa.C.S. §3921 theft): Coercive orders under color of law.
- Money Laundering (18 U.S.C. §§1956/1957): Mismatched funds (30-50% siphoned, per audits).
- Kidnapping/Interference (18 U.S.C. §1201; 18 Pa.C.S. §2904): Unequal custody without due process.
- Obstruction/Tampering (18 U.S.C. §§1503/1505/1512/1513): Defaults, dismissals, retaliation.
- Perjury (18 U.S.C. §1621; 18 Pa.C.S. §4902): False petitions/affidavits.
- Peonage/Trafficking (18 U.S.C. §§1581/1590): Debt coercion, child seizure.
- Each act in my case (PFA fraud, support extortion, custody denial) is a predicate—ongoing since 2021 (pattern spans 10+ years, multiple victims).

Proximate Causation and Standing Analysis: Direct Harm from Cartel Acts

Standing: Injury-in-fact (custody loss, financial ruin, trauma—concrete, particularized; *Spokeo v. Robins*, 578 U.S. 330 (2016)). Traceable to defendants (Mahon's orders, DRS enforcement, federal funding). Redressable (damages, injunction; *Lujan v. Defs. of Wildlife*, 504 U.S. 555 (1992)). Proximate cause: Cartel acts (void orders, defaults) directly caused harms (not attenuated; *Holmes v. Sec. Investor Prot. Corp.*, 503 U.S. 258 (1992)). No break in chain—your silence/retaliation foreseeably worsened. Standing solid; causation undisputed (no "derivative" bar per *Bank of Am. Corp. v. Knight*, 574 U.S. 1123 (2015)).

Private Right of Action and Treble Damages Justification: Statutory Remedies for Cartel Victims

Private right under §1983 (*Maine v. Thiboutot*, 448 U.S. 1 (1980)) and RICO §1964(c) (direct injury from predicates). Treble damages justified: Willful/patterned conduct (RICO purpose: deter organized crime; *Agency Holding Corp. v. Malley-Duff & Assocs.*, 483 U.S. 143 (1987)). My harms (irreparable family destruction, \$41K+ theft) warrant maximum—punitive for malice. No cap; full recovery.

Habeas Corpus Relief (42 Pa.C.S.A. § 6501 et seq.): Immediate Release from Unlawful Restraint

Under Pennsylvania habeas (42 Pa.C.S.A. §6501 et seq.), I am unlawfully restrained by void orders (custody/support/contempt threats). Jurisdiction: State courts, but federal question (supremacy) allows removal/parallel federal habeas (28 U.S.C. §2254 if exhausted, but futility exception; *Preiser v. Rodriguez*, 411 U.S. 475 (1973) distinguished—no release sought beyond declaratory). Relief: Vacate all orders, restore status quo, discharge arrears. Defaults admit voidness (§6502 custody/support habeas).

- Contempt Threat: Preemptive habeas against incarceration (no willfulness).

Biblically, "let my people go" (*Exodus 5:1*). Legally: Immediate hearing (Pa.R.Crim.P. 108); void ab initio (no jurisdiction). Grant now—defaults prove entitlement.

NOTICE OF RESTRAINT AND PHASE III

Just so we're all clear here, this present body of work is actually an act of restraint as opposed to an act of overreach. As of right now, Federal Agencies and Agents are largely unimpacted. I have limited my criminal complaints to the sphere of my direct personal knowledge. This mostly impacts the Pennsylvania judicial branch and local county and court. You know the people that have been harming me for five years.

When the FOIA comes in I'll have access to 50 State Plans all of which are signed by State Governors (I may have to work through obstruction first). I know that every single state executive branch is part of this swindle. I know that every State DHS, County, State District Court, and Country DRS are part of this. I'll have the evidence in hand after the FOIA (or after their obstruction fails). The damages could reach quadrillions.

I'll have data that shows that there is a large discrepancy between the amount of Child Support collected (largely from husbands) and how much has been disbursed (mostly to wives). There is a sizable gap between those two indicative of accounting fraud, which leads to more wire fraud and mail fraud. More participants in this scheme. More claims of conspiracy, and more ties to treason and sedition across nearly every layer of government and all geographies.

You have created an interstate, federally subsidized cartel conglomerate that operates in every state and county. If need be I will pull this thing from the roots dragging everyone into conspiracy with treason typically via obstruction and silence.

We have the option of making gentle changes that come with voluntary compliance of state and federal governments who replace senior members with newer members and teach the DOs and DON'Ts of Federal Supremacy or we can make more abrupt changes that come with compulsory financial and criminal enforcement and periods of "Judicial Reconstruction."

I'm tired. I would like to hang out with my kids and enjoy the lifestyle afforded by the enormous sum of money coming my way. I plan to build cities and universities around the world to honor God and teach Religion, Science, Law, and Love. But in case it isn't clear, I think I have demonstrated a willingness to pursue this to whatever degree is necessary to achieve fairness and justice.

This document was just PHASE II, and it's going to impact the Pennsylvania Judiciary. Phase III, depending on how this is handled, will impact every state executive, every state judiciary, every county, and Federal Agencies and Agents. PHASE III can be slow and gentle or abrupt and punishing. That depends on your compliance.

I'm deliberately restraining myself. I'm still playing "Let Go." I have a magic wand of Treason such that if you don't comply you're an accessory after the fact, a coconspirator, and you're facing penalties far beyond "obstruction."

Honestly, I don't feel compelled to move onto PHASE III, but if you're still holding on, if you're still planning to let Mahon adjudicate my matters in the abysmal absence of Federal Supremacy, if you're still planning to put more fathers through this, then so help me God- Graduated Overload is coming your way and I'll see this through to my last breath. Like I said, I'll die on this hill.

SUMMARY AND CONCLUSION

Agents of the defendants: In the end, my demands are simple and rooted in the Biblical call for justice and restoration, as in Micah 6:8: "He hath shewed thee, O man, what is good; and what doth the Lord require of thee, but to do justly, and to love mercy, and to walk humbly with thy God?" I just want restoration of my rights that I lawfully possess. Stop harming me with your fraudulent actions and unlawful denials. Act lawfully, as divine and American law command, by cleaning up my records to erase all false charges and negative marks.

You have accumulated a debt so far of many trillions of dollars and it's still rising daily. This isn't going away. It's only going to get worse and harder. It's going to go state by state and through many layers of federal agency in PHASE III.

So, there's a brief pause here, a chance to correct course, repent, and cure the deficiencies and irregularities. The alternative is abrupt change, treason charges everywhere, and a rather abrupt halt to operations.

In the end... these several hundred pages and trillions in damages makes me think that Bill may have been right all along, but not for the reason he declared. Federal Supremacy does get convoluted. It's simple in the lawful implementation, but it sure does get convoluted when it's not applied. Fortunately, I'm a PhD chemist and a world class instructor. I can teach these complicated concepts to anyone that may need to hear them to determine if crimes and damages have occurred.

GRAND JURY

18 U.S. Code § 3332 - Powers and duties

Grievance in the style of Writ of Certiorari is submitted to the Disciplinary Board of the Supreme Court of Pennsylvania, pursuant to Pa.R.D.E. 201 et seq. and the inherent supervisory authority of the Supreme Court over the Pennsylvania Bar, seeking immediate review of the egregious, systemic misconduct admitted by the below-listed attorneys through their collective failure to respond to duly served notices, affidavits, and constitutional interrogatories, as well as their defaults on Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) requests under 5 U.S.C. § 552 and Pennsylvania's Right-to-Know Law (65 P.S. §§ 67.101 et seq.).

These attorneys—judges, district attorneys, court officials, and disciplinary overseers—have, by their silence and inaction, admitted to participating in a statewide "Black Collar Cartel" racket involving treasonous subversion of Federal Supremacy (U.S. Const. art. VI, cl. 2), RICO predicate acts (18 U.S.C. § 1961 et seq.), misprision of treason (18 U.S.C. § 2382), obstruction of justice (18 U.S.C. § 1503; 18 Pa.C.S. § 5101), witness intimidation (18 U.S.C. § 1513; 18 Pa.C.S. § 4952), money laundering (18 U.S.C. § 1956), human trafficking via fraudulent child custody/support orders (18 U.S.C. § 1589), and dereliction of duty in enforcing federal mandates under Title IV-D Cooperative Agreements (§9: Affirmation of Federal Supremacy).








7. The only time that the Defendant made a payment towards his arrears was after spending a weekend in Lancaster County Prison.
8. The Defendant was previously scheduled to appear before Judge Hackman for contempt proceedings. However, once he recused himself, the contempt issue was never addressed by another judge.
9. The contempt proceedings were also delayed previously due to the support hearing taking over a year to complete and then the resulting Superior Court appeal also delayed the contempt action to be scheduled.
10. In the meantime, Plaintiff has had to borrow money to pay for her bills and to support the parties' children.
11. Since June 2025, Plaintiff has had sole physical custody of the Children, resulting in the Plaintiff spending more to care for them.
12. Defendant has the means to pay his support in full each month as he has continuously advocated for their children to attend private school at a cost of over \$30,000 a year.
13. Defendant is a partner in the company that he works for and is able to control how much he is paid through payroll to prevent garnishment of his wages in the full support amount, knowing that Domestic Relations will only garnish up to 55% of a person's net income.
14. Plaintiff is requesting that this matter be scheduled before Judge Mahon as soon as possible so that the Judge can find the Defendant in contempt and order a purge amount.

WHEREFORE, Petitioner prays that the Court issue an order directing the attendance of Defendant at a hearing of said Petition and hereafter to make an




